





#### 5th Battalion Standing Orders

- 1. Any Volunteer found guilty of undermining the Staff, will be dealt with severely.
- 2. Anyone found guilty of Loose Talk will be dealt with
- 3. Smuggling of letters (in or out) will not be tolerated, unless permission is granted beforehand by the Staff.
- 4. Any Volunteer applying for Compassionate Parole, must get permission from the Batt. Staff, (if permission is granted and she wishes an extension, she must work through Sinn Féin outside).
- 5. All statements going to the papers must go through the Batt. R.R.O. via Company P.R.O.
- 6. On the day of the funeral of a Volunteer, all radios, T.V's, record players and recreation will be suspended for that day (except for News) until after the funeral. There will be Commemoration Parades on the first Sunday after the burial of a Vol. Full dress on this Sunday to be worn to Mass.
- News, Irish Political and National Music Programmes will have first preference on Radios and T.V's.
- 8. Aggro with Screws or Loyalists will not be tolerated (if a Volunteer has a complaint against either of these par-ties, she is to report it to her Company staff immediate-
- 9. All Volunteers must have cells cleaned out by 10.00 a.m.
- 10. All Volunteers reporting sick must remain in bed until the following morning.
- 11. There is to be no noise after twelve midnight.12. Anyone wishing to see the Welfare must have prior per-

- mission from Company O.C. Any Welfare matter the O.C. deals with will be kept in strict confidence.
- 13. All Volunteers must be ready on the day of their visits. This is to ensure that our Visitors are not kept waiting.
- 14. No property within the Company is to be damaged or destroyed and all Company notice are to be obeyed
- 15. All Volunteers must be locked in cells ten minutes after the meals are brought onto the wing to enable the checks to be made. All Volunteers must be locked up at night at the time decided by O.C. and Staff of Company Prison.
- 16. All Volunteers must make the best possible use of Educational Facilities in Gaol. This is to ensure that Volunteers do not waste their time.
- All Volunteers must duly elect their O.C. twice a year in the months of January and July. Company Staff must also be elected.
- 18. It must be stressed that P.D.F. work is an important aspect of working for the Republican Movement. By helping the Green Cross Volunteers in Prison will be helping the families of prisoners who might otherwise be in need.
- 19. Drill is an important part of discipline in the gaol but the times and regularity of drill will be left to the discretion of the T.O. and Staff of the gaol. Anyone with a genuine com-plaint or reason as to why they should not partake in drill can obtain permission to absent themselves from the O.C.
- 20. Staff Meetings will be held once a month unless there is an emergency.

#### 'A' Company Orders

1. Cell Inspection at 10.00 a.m.

Drill immediately after inspection.

Fall in immediately order is given at night. If you want permission to stay up late see your Branch O.C.

Once dismissed order is given, go straight to cells.

First Sunday Parades

Wear uniform - black jumper and skirt - to mass.

Parade at 3.00 p.m. Full uniform to be worn.

#### 2. VISITS & PARCELS

Visitors don't overstay if screw objects.

Visitors can be barred by Governor.

If anything is missing from Parcel - cigarettes or letters etc., inform Branch O.C.

Letters to go out on visit must be handed in on the day before visit. Do not ask for Special Visit unless really needed.

#### 3. LOCK-UP

12.30 p.m. - 1.30 p.m. 4.30 p.m. - 5.30 p.m. 8.30 p.m. Do not ask for cell door to be opened unless sick.

No more than three girls in a cell.

Do not ask for Stand-By unless emergency.

Keep noise down at night and silence after twelve.

#### 4. CLEANING

To be done early every morning. O.C. and Adjutant to check cleaning. Monthly Springclean. Cleaning leaders to sort out jobs.

Political Status was fought for and won by brave men and women. It is up to us to show by our behaviour that we are worthy to be called Politial Prisoners. We can best do this by showing respect to our Officers in the Company who are doing their best to see that everything runs smoothly and fairly within the Gaol.

If you have any complaints they will be listened to and acted upon see your Branch O.C. or Adjutant.
