WEEKS WERE SPENT DIGGING WITH THE MOST BASIC OF IMPLEMENTS. ON 5TH MAY 1976 NINE INLA PRISONERS MADE A DARING ESCAPE FROM LONG KESH.



"We dug about 6 foot down and headed towards the perimeter wall. We divided up into teams and worked almost 247 in the digging. We would stop an hour before lock up/head-count at night and an hour before unlock/head-count in the morning. Each team throughout the day and night got breaks for food and sleep with smaller breaks for cups of tea and a smoke.

"As the tunnel progressed a stick with a white hankie would be poked up through the ceiling of the tunnel to gauge the distance and direction of the tunnel itself. We normally went down the tunnel wearing just football shorts as it was quite warm despite the wetness and flooding at times from rain falls."
