Secondly I wanted to be prepared to defend my fellow countrymen if the Loyalist murder gangs go for UDI and begin to slaughter the people of the North. The babies cried out, he heard the sick cough and vomit, suffocated by the gas. He watched as others mopped away the blood of the fallen Irish dead.

He was only 12 years old when the booming sound of bin lids, whistles and shouts woke him from his slumber. Frightened and confused he

He was just 13 young years when the streets of Derry were spattered by the blood of 13 men, when the British Army who came to keep the peace, slaughtered the men in Derry that day. He watched his mother cry, and the British huns they laughed, he heard the loyalist say 'it was a good Sunday.'

Fourteen was his age of reckoning when his approaching manhood came upon the notice of the British soldiers. Degraded, searched, screened and then allowed to pass, with foul abuse hurled after him. He was 15 when

joined the same queue his father joined before him. At 15 he had joined the ranks of the long list of the ranks of the long list of lirish men unemployed be cause of English crimes. At 16 he watched his friends nowed down, he watched their funerals pass, and he watched the British soldiers who came to keep the peace laugh and jeer and call them

In February 1976, this boy was 17, and he died fighting for his nations freedom, died in the ranks of Oglaigh na h-Eireann, fighting the self-same huns who came to keep the peace. He will never see 18, this boy who never knew what it meant to play the games of childhood, who never knew his youth. He was dead and he was just 17 when a quisling from the SDLP slurred his young name, but we will not forget.

U.S. GOVERNMENT DENIES BRITISH CLAIMS ON U.S. ARMS AID

The U.S. Defence Depart-

The U.S. Defence Department has denied a British government claim that 75 per cent of the arms and money sent to Northern Ireland come from the United States. Such claims were recently made by Prime Minister Harold Wilson, Stanley Orme and other British politicians.

The United States denial was contained in a efense Department letter sent to the National Council of Irish Americans in Buffalo, New York. The letter is dated January loth, 1976 and signed by Harry E. Bergold Jr. Mr. Bergold, Assistant Secretary of Defense, denied that US intelligence services had ever made, such alaim and denied the existence of "any U.S. Military Intelligence Report on this

Mr. Bergold emphatically denied the accuracy of a New York Times article which referred to the alleged US Intelligence Report.

A spokesman for the Nation al Council of Irish Americans in Buffalo, New York, issued this statement.

"The British government has, once again, been caught fabricating the news. We are glad to note our government's denial of, this story. This is just one more example of Britain's policy of fictionalising the news. British efforts to blame Irish Americans for Britain's Vietnam in Ulster, have failed. When Prime Minister Harold Wilson has to go so far as t o fake has to go so far as t o fake "news" reports, we know how bankrupt British policy is in Northern Ireland."

WASHINGTON POST EXPOSE:

DIRTY TRICKS COMMANDOS

Does British military intelligence write the news for British and American newsgence write the news for British and American newspapers? The prestigious Washington Post, one of America's most respected newspapers, says it doesn't provide the sale of the British SIS intelligence agents of the British SIS intelligence unit. The Post charged that all London newspapers were at least partially staffed by writers on the payroll of the SIS. The Washington Post story quoted a Fleet Street editor.

quoted a Fleet Street editor

as saying that "more than half of that particular paper's staffers are on the SIS payroll." "That paper" is believed to be the London Telegraph, also known as the English Pravda by many American and European jour nalists.

The Washington Post article describes the SAS as "dirty tricks commandos" of the SIS. The SAS has operated in Northern Ireland since at least 1970. The Washington Post story lends some credence to IRA claims that the SAS and SIS are partly responsible for the many so called "sectarian" killings in Northern Ireland, In any

event, Irish readers now have

event, Irish readers now have had their suspicions about the SIS confirmed by the Washing ton Post. The English government is said to be incensed over the story.

The Washington Post article written by Bernard Nossiter, one of America's most respected journalists, has raised the ire of British Home Office Officials and top ranking anofficers of the British army. It is understood that Prime Minister Harold Wilson personally contacted President Gerald Ford in an effort to silence the editors of the Post. It was the Washington Post which exposed the Watergate scandal and brought about the resignation

of Richard Nixon. SAS use of assassination as a political weapon is described in the article and one British ex-diplomat is quoted as admitting that the British govern ment does use assassination and has "plans for the assassination of leaders. It's perfectly normal in this sort of dirty game," according to the ex-diplomat.

Nossiter outlines SIS operations, pointing out that 'SIS officers use the cover of businessmen. An unknown number are posing as journalists." According to Nossiter, the SIS and SAS carry out British policy and the "foreign policy line laid down by the foreign office."

The Post story is certain to cause Britain great em-barrassment. Various Ameri-can journalists societies have already indicated their con-cern over the use of jour-nalists by the British Govern-



The National Council of Irish Americans has already embarked on an investigation into the use of SIS written stories published in American newspapers. A representative of the Council is Buffalo, New York indicated that several U.S. papers were co-operating in the Council's investigation which will cattempt to identify SIS operatives in Britain and the United States.











ICRA Demand Withdrawal of British Troops from Ireland

The Irish Civil Rights Association (Britain), condemn the British Government in the strongest possible terms for the inhumane treatment met-ed out to Frank Stagg who was tortured to death in Wakefield Prison Yorkshire.



THE FACTS

For the last eight months For the last eight months Lebanon has seen vicious fighting that has spread to every town and village in the country, Lebanon was on the brink of an all-out armed conflict. The risk of such a conflict house considerably increased because Lebanon is situated in a part of the world which has become is situated in a part of the world which has become



a battle ground for all the great world powers. It has also given shelter to a great number of Palestinian refugees, forced from their own country by Tionier refugees, forced from their own country by Zionism. Many people will find it hard to believe that centries after the crusades, in Palestine, the same scenario is repeating itself with Moslems and Christians fighting each other. The imperialist press has in fact drawn such a picture in order to mislead the peoples of the world as to the true facts of the struggle.

THE ISSUES OF THE WAR

The truth is that the fighting in London is nothing whatsoever like a religious conflict. The resistance in Ireland has seen the British press attempt the same distortions in order to weaken the support for the Irish Republican Army. The Lebanon conflict began 8 months ago following the murder of the elected representative Maarouf Saad, who held progressive views. Saad was murdéred while leading a demonstration of fisher-The truth is that the fightwas murgered while leading a demonstration of fisher-men/labourers in Saida. The real issues of the war rev-olve around the campaign for the betterment of the working-class increased salar-ies, guarantees of social security for the sons of the poorest stc. Saad also wanted the Labour Goeernemnt to send the army to defend

tration i.e. the President, the Army GHQ, Police and 'In-telligence' (Special Branch to our friends in Ireland) plus other public institutions is exclusively in the hands of schusively in the hands of the Maronite aristocracy. (The Maronite Rite is one of the Christian traditions). The people wanted changes in the constitution so that the President would be elected after free elections and not, as he is now, by a Parliament representing political and religious feudilism. The mass of the people also demanded a constitutional army council to lead the army instead, of, as it is now, one right-wing Maronite officer who is a colleague of the President. They also wanted an immediate end to the armanent race by the the armament race by the right-wing who had just created four Fascist type militia who were link-ed to 4 extreme right-wing parties.

These parties are:

(a). The Liberal National Party. Leader M. Camille Chamoun, Interior Minister, Former President who, in 1958, called the 7th American fleet to Lebanon to crush the popular rising against his corrupt regime. His militia are called The Tigers.

(b). The Phalangist Party. Led by the Mp Pierre Gemayel and his two sons. This party is very similar to Franco's Phalanges.

(c). The Maronite League These parties are:

The President supplies all these groups with military equipment bought by the Lebanese army from imperial-stpowers, Recently a Spanish ship was discovered, loaded with arms, lying in anchor in a military dock. The prime Minister appealed to the President to arrest those involved in the smuggling of the shipment but the latter publicly refused to do so. The right wing militat then openly unloaded the cargo with the assistance of the army.

THE LEFT

The open provocation by the right-wing militia and the army led to a counter attack from the people, the counter attack from the people, the counter attack was remarkable not only in strength but by the mass mobilisation of the people. The organisations in the uprising are:

Some young Maronites have recently joined the leftist front to fight against the exclusively Maronite establish ment Most of the Christian traditions outside the Maronites support the people's claims as they too have suffered under the boot of the sectarian Maronites. The result of this situation is that the war is a conflict between the various religious sections of the Lebanese people and the ruling class. The ruling class are the Maronite churchmen and the political and religious feudalists who have ruled Lebanon since the French granted the country its independence.

ROOTS OF CONFLICT

If one wants to seek out the deep roots of the Civil War they would have to go back to pre-independence days when the Maronite comdays when the Maronite com-munity, then living in the mountains of Lebanon, had become one of the forces of the colonialist establish-ment. Maronite support of the French presence was open and active where as the the French presence was open and active where as the other traditions had decided to wage a war of resistance against the occupation forces. When the French were finally forced to leave Lebanon they first sent up a constitution and laws that ensured wide priviliges to their Maronite allies.

The effects of the colonial laws could be seen and felt at every level of administration in the state. The Parliament was established with a built-in Maronite majority although that tradition was itself a minotis

in Lebanon. The Maronites became the exploiters, hold-ing all power and suppress-ing the Lebanese people. ing the Lebanese people into two distinct groups. Ist and 2nd class citizens. Ist Class for the Maronites, who enjoued the protection of the French. And 2nd Class for the rest, Catholics, Armenium McMerch 2018. ians, Moslems.

ATTACKS ON PALESTIANS

Shortly before the conflict started the Lebanese
Government attempted to
crush the Palestinian Resiscrush the Palestinian Resistance who are the natural allies of the popular movement, he President, Frangie, ordered his army Chief-of-Staff, the reactionary Alexander Chanem, to launch massive attacks on the camps of the Palestinian refugees in Safih. For days tanks and planes were used against the refugees, when the smoke planes were used against the refugees, when the smoke cleared the Lebanese army were on the verge of total defeat. The patriotic movement had realising the plot mobilised all its members and took over Beyrouth, putting up barricades and repelling the Lebanese repelling army.
The pre

The present scheme to liquidage the Palestinian resistance is the attempt to crush the popular movements using the right-wing militias. This is what started the armed struggle some 9 months ago, the right-wing parties, having failed to massacre the Palestinians and the popular movement, are now asking for Lebanon to be partitioned. Tony Francies, sone of the reactionary President, has publicly demanded partition and the setting up of 'a secta rian Maronite state in the North. This scheme is similar in many ways to the Israeli/ American blueprint which gave birth to the Zionist state of Israel in occupied alestine. A Maronite state would take pressure off Israel thus giving them breathing space, Palestinians would be offered the Southern parts of ebanon to create a new homeland and, Israel, hope, abandonment of the claim to occupied Palestine.

The people of Ireland will well understand the apprehension which is being felt by the working-class in Lebanon, partition could lead to more bitterness and bloodshed than has been experienced at any time in Lebanose history. present scheme to

READER SLAMS REPUBLICAN INTERVI

MALONE ROAD BARD

I would like to make some observations on the long interview published in Republican News February 1st 1976. In recent years the Republican Movement has gone through a big change in quantity and composition but not a corresponding change in political programme or methods etc.. put bluntly, the great mass of youth in the vanguard of action against British troops come from the 6 counties

Propaganda and political statements still make big concessions to middle class conceptions and idealisms holding never ending delusions for movements under middle class leadership but with a great bulk of working class rank and file.

THE PEACE THEME

The basic one is on the "Peace" theme. The establishment organisations call for peace - unconditional. The Movement genaflects to this Peace with Peace with Justice. At least put Justice first, Peace, that tenuous notion, second. For a long time we were given the illusion that loyalists were only innocent dupes of imperialism who were ready to embrace the IRA once the Brits were gone; in the meantime they were "Irish" enough not to attack fellow country men or do anything un-Irish like assassination, chauvinistic TV Millitaney for sectarian gains culminating in the organisation of the UWC Strike by masses of workers under a Fascist banner. The Blueshirts have learned their lesson and have recently formed their own Trade Union Group. recent events have at lasts brought a public appraisal of what loyalism is all about; gone are the headlines - "The UVF are men." Many slogans often are idealistic and meaningless in relation to the struggle e.g. "73 year of victory" etc.

Great concessions too are made to the trendy idealogy of "Christ was a communist," in the interview. In a populist way this can be argued as true, but it takes little account of the origins of present day society, it's material base and the unending opposition of capital and labour (the working-class) which have endured through the phase of Fuedalism from slavery that Christ knew two thousand years ago in roman oppressed Palestine.

'MUTUAL CRITICISM'

There is an amount of mutual criticism between the Provos and the left i.e. the Revolutionary left. Left wingers are often accused of being atuomatically stickies by Provos who feel the ultimatum of "Britain must go" is politics enough to sustain an anti-imperialist struggle in its fullest sense the advantage of the Provos in Ireland is that Republicanism is the revolutionary tradition in the country, with a consistent past and a heroic history since the upsurge of bourgeoise revolutions in Europe from France in 1789 which inspired the '98 men. Paradoxically however there are few revolutions anywhere today striving to set up an National Republic as such

with prime emphasis on language and culture. Today revolutions are fought on the aim of a Socialist Revolution, the working class fighting for it's own politics and leading that fight. There are many such struggles going today where working class leadership is in control, e.g. the MPLA, the Guerillas in Argentina. The Tupamoros, etc. Peasants too can and do have a vital support role in such struggles.

'IGNORED REAL INVOLVEMENT'

The Provos have ignored real involvement with the working class especially in Dublin in my experience. The leadership has consistently refused to support or encourage mobilisations from building sites and factories, which have occurred at crucial times of crisis in the past. There was wide-spread working class downing of tools to protest at the OASA Amendment and the McStiofan upsurges, workers who marched to Leinster House got a Government reply when they demanded action on the plight of Frank Stagg in November 1973 were looked on as somewhat of a wonder and useful for propaganda, the real political experience for Provos involved and wider significance was completely lost on the leader ship in Kevin Street.

No effort was made to relate to the Portlaoise Hunger Strike to workers around the industrial estates in Dublin despite Pat Ward being a well reputed militant on the building site in Fordered. England.

'NOT WORKING CLASS MOVEMENT'.

The Provos membership contains a lot of working class but it is not honest to claim to be a working class movement. It does not in principle use working class organisations to further it's goals and, from the experience, develop its programme according to the needs of those who comprise the "forces of production". The working class is their only ally and they must respond to it's needs, taking the Trade Linion struggle to workers is not only about wages but about politics too, repression and harassment. No isolated group however pure minded will defeat imperialism in these times of advanced almalgamations of capital. This struggle is international. Lately a useful development is the encouragement apparently given to the T.O.M. This can be opportunism toos seeking to use such mobilisations as propaganda scoring points. With the slide towards repression both economic and political in the 26 counties the "working class will come under the brunt of harsh measures. It is the job of revolutionaries to point out the fundamental political nature of unemployment, "the North", "the Budget," to workers, where they work and politicise and organise and build fighting organisations to defend these rights to work and liberty. The Republican movement will be irrelevant to those it aims to help by it's claim if it does not.


