POBLACHT NA H-EIREANN THE PROVISIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE IRISH REPUBLIC TO THE PEOPLE OF IRELAND.

IRISHMEN AND IRISHWOMEN, in the name of God and of the dead generations from which we receive our tradition of nationalism, Ireland, through us, summons her children to her flag and stakes her freedom.

Having organised and trained her manpower through her secret revolutionary organisation, the Irish Republican Brotherhood, and through her open militia organisations, the Irish Volunteers and the Irish Citizens Army, having patiently perfected her discipline, having resolutely waited for the right moment to reveal itself, the new state that moment, and supported by her united children in America and by gallant allies in Europe, has today in her own strength, she strikes at the heart of British rule in Ireland.

We declare the right of the people of Ireland to the ownership of Ireland, and of the natural resources of Ireland, to be complete and indivisible. The long usurpation of that right by a foreign people and government has not extinguished the right, nor can it ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Irish people. In every generation the Irish people have asserted their right to national freedom and sovereignty; it is times during the past three hundred years they have asserted it in arms. Standing on that fundamental right and again asserting it in arms in the face of the world, we hereby proclaim the Irish Republic, as a Sovereign Independent State, and that we will maintain it by all means which are just and reasonable, and by all such means as we shall see fit to employ in order to secure the freedom, peace, and well-being of the Irish people.

The Irish Republic is entitled to, and hereby claims, the allegiance of every Irishman and Irishwoman. The Republic guarantees religious and civil liberty, equal rights and equal opportunities to all its citizens, and declares its resolve to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation, and of all its parts, cherishing all the children of the nation equally, and abstaining from the interference in the private lives of citizens, which has been one of the marks of the tyrannies of the past.

Until our arms have brought the opportune moment for the establishment of a permanent National Government, representative of the whole people of Ireland and elected by the suffrages of all its men and women, the Provisional Government, hereby constituted, will administer the civil and military affairs of the Republic in trust for the people.

We place the cause of the Irish Republic under the protection of the Most High God. Whosoever shall think upon our arms, and we pray that some who serve that cause will discontinue all its activities, and declare its resolve to pursue the happiness and prosperity of the whole nation, and of all its parts, cherishing all the children of the nation equally, and abstaining from the interference in the private lives of citizens, which has been one of the marks of the tyrannies of the past.
