tiberty to give your name, address, age, where you're coming from and going to, and if you have knowledge of any illegal activities. To the last question you may simly reply "NO". It is not necessary for you to indulge in conversation with BRITS. They often do this to help collet intelligence in the area.

(B) If arrested you may be held for varying periods. If a Brit arrests you it will be for again" No, men have been shot trying to get out approx. Ahrs. If you'te arrested under sect 10 or 12 that will be for 72 hrs and 7 days respectively. (Only the R.U.C. can do this).

(C) When arrested you must answer the questions already mentioned. If you are qurstioned further you may refuse tosay anything further and escape. If Ireland had a high stanard of living for all its people, where equality, licerty and true justice reigned, then orvious sly there would be no war at present, but of course that is not the case.

For a happy and content society things are nessasary. Fair employment, adequate housing, recreation with entertainment and a society where problems and injustices can be voiced and solved. These are absent for the most part in Ireland and this situation remains, so by sectarian and corrupt legis<mark>la</mark>tion. Of course this is no surprising since to grant these conditions a Governmentto care for the Irish People, while its main aim is to surpress those same people and keep the Irish Nation subjudated to explcit it in Britain's own interests.

There fore an essenttial point must be grasped. The English Army is not a peace keeping force England has a vested intrest economically and this point is proven by the fact that naturally the English Army, the most repressive ambascodor of English authority, is sent to Ireland when that infemous political dead duck of Stermont was unable to cope with the "Native Unrest".
