

COMIC OPERA


And so it goes on... The comic opera in Longkesh which is being presided over by the "hanging judge" Brown. The purpose of this fiasco is to determine whether or not an Internee is 'safe' enough to be allowed to go back to his family. Even if the Brown Advisory Committee recommend the release of an Internee it is not guaranteed that Nutcase Faulkner will agree with the findings.

Three men, including Jim O'Kane could have their freedom anytime they wished simply by signing a form declaring that they would never again be bad boys, but like freemen in any corner of the globe they will suffer the horror of Britain's concentration camps rather

than betray their consciences.

Among the 'dangerous' men whom Faulkner decided were a threat to the security of Stormont is 70 year old Liam Mullholland, a stalward in the Sinn Fein movement for many years. The people of Andersonstown should be able to walk through their own streets without interference from anyone....they have the

right to sit in the privacy of their own homes without the worry of intimidation from thugs, whether in or out of uniform... they have the right to to able to let their wives and daughters out without worrying about them being molested by vermin. No one is punished unless the evidence against them is overwhelming, indeed the person on trial will get the benefit of any doubt. We now repeat the warning that has been disregarded by some people...TO THEIR COST... Crime within our communities must stop, the people have suffered enough at has hands of the Invaders.

The British Army have very kindly agreed to look after him during his stay in N.I. and even provided him with an Army helicopter so that he could fly to Coleraine with Mr. E.B. Last night(Friday) saw a continuance of the Eritish Army policy of indiscriminate searches. During the night and early morning they searched houses throughout the Upper Andersonstown and Lenadoon area.

There was, as usual no pattern to their searching and, again as usual no reasons were given to the house-holders to explain why their privacy was being invaded.

Iney have Interned all they possibly can and have found that it makes not the slightest difference to the campaigns being waged against them on both the military and political fronts.

We can expect more attempts to coerce us in the near future and we can be assure that they will fail just as completely as

the last.

To set the record straight we mist admit that the searches last night were a departure from the usual British rattern in that the soldiers seemed, in the majority of cases to be reasonable. Of course there might be those who regard the breaking down of their door at four o'clock in the morning as being slightly un-reasonable but then there's no pleasing some people.



OPERATIONS

On Trursday 25th. 2nd. '71, An Active Service Unit ambushed a Saracen at the top of Bingnian Drive. Three British Soldiers were injured, one seriously. The ambush was planned to ensure that no civilians would be in the line of fire. After the A.S.U. had withdrawn the British soldiers opened fire on several Home Boys who were working in the grounds of St. Patricks, (these were the youths who were later said to be helping them with their enquiries.) Whilst firing at the Home the Occupation Forces hit the windows of nearby St, Theresas School. Later that evening on T.V. a British Hajor complained about the "lack of concern shown by the terrorists". The people of indersonstown know who fired on the school, it was not the Republican Army. A series of attacks on the British Occupying Forces took place during the week. At least 12 seperate incidents were recorded. Active Service Units of the I.R.A. operated on a wide front on Honday and Tuesday making concerted attacks in Lenadoon, indersonstown and Turf Lodge. The irmy billet in Lenadoon, known to locals as 'the Hole In The Wall' had its umpteeni bonb was planted in the house next door while troops were busy engaging an A.S.U. who had been attacking the post for a peroid of 20 minutes. Prior to this attack the teachers in the Blessed Oliver Plunkett School had been told to keep the children in. A further attack on the billet took place later on the same night.

Last Saturday evening British Troops set up a camera team on the Monagh Rd. roundabout (for reasons known only to themselves) The same evening an A.S.U. engaged the soldiers hitting two. The condition of the shot nen was thought to be serious. This was confirmed later on the same night when two youths who had been arrested were told while in the Henry Taggart Interrogation Room by their captor, a Hajor... "You bastards have wrecked a couple of my men and your going to pay for it". The youths were later released.


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During the week three youths were attacked by British Soldiers on their way home from a Disco, (the youths, not the soldiers) The attack was unprovoked and a local Ex-Serviceman who went to the aid of the youths was threatened with being shot if he did'nt go away. Hajor Redwood who is the O.C. in charge of the Taggart was on hand to witness the incident and when asked by locals who had gathered

why his troops did'nt raid the Springnartin Estate, a known U.V.F. stronghold,
he answered, "We know there are arms dumps
in that area but we can't raid without
Government permission and the Government
will not allow us!

If Major Redwood is a sincere man he will
make this statement in public and thus
go a long way towards easing the temperature in the Ballymurphy estate.

Before writing this we realise that we will be accused of being both un-christian and uncharitiable, but be assured that we could contribute nothing if we added to the HYPOCRITICAL and unrealistic comment pouring forth from the vehicles of the mass-media by so called leaders. Brian Faulkner, John Taylor and the other permanent members of the Joint Security Committee have been directly responsible for untold death, suffering, torture and brutality practised by the British Army and the R.U.C. against the anti- Unionists in the 6-Counties. Their bloodied hands are responsible for the burning of working class homes and the killings of August 169, for Internment and the bloody orgy of murder in Derry on Bloody Sunday. They have yet to render any words of sod-ace to any of the people they have brutalised, and still we wait for any words of sympathy to be expressed from them to relatives of the Derry dead. Second only to Brian Faulkner, John Taylor has been one of the principle architecs of so many of the policies of oppression bestowed on the people of the North. The blame for so many young Irishmen, women and children and indeed so many young Englishmen lying in pools of blood in our country, can be laid squarely in their doorstep. We have made clear on numerous occasions that we take no pleasure whatsoever in the death of any man, no-matter what his class creed or colour, but in the case of John Taylor we will not give vent to hypocritical words; make no mistake about that. John Taylor has paid, in part for some of the suffering he has inflicted, and the sooner he, and those who believe that they can indefinately coerce the working class people of Ireland with impunity, learn that peace does not mean our oppression, the better for all our people. Let us make clear now that our sincere sy mpathy goes to his young wife and to his
