This, however, without any prejudice to the opinion of the Comhairle that such a measure could be nothing more than a stop-gap as the only real answer to any housing crisis is to provide sufficient housing to meet the needs of the people, thus eliminating the necessity for a points system in the first place

# LANDLORDISM - 1976

Michael McCarthy, his wife and child lived in a three roomed flat in Sunlodge, Ballintemple for almost two years.

Their rent was £5 per week.

Their landlord was Maurice Daly of Riverstown.

Both landlord and tenant worked in the postal service.

In July of 1975 the flat was redecorated by the tenant and an effort was made to increase the rent to £6.50 per week.

This led to a dispute and on November 19th last a court order for the eviction of the tenant was granted subject to a stay of execution of 2 months.

On 5th February 1976 a representative of the Sheriffs Office accompanied by eight Gardai arrived at the flat while the tenant was at work, evicted his wife and child, took the key leaving the tenants furniture in the flat.

The Corporation were unwilling to help and when the tenant eventually found alternative accommodation he was unable to get his furniture without paying elleged arrears of rent.

Unfortunately he contacted the sinn Fein Citizens Advice Bureau at a stage at which it was too

late for them to be of as much help as they would otherwise have been
