#### MID-ULSTER ELECTION 1956

IN THE ELECTIONS OF 1918 THE IRISH PEOPLE, BY AN OVERWHELMING MAJ-ORITY REPUDIATED THE CLAIMS OF ENGLAND AND HER PARLIAMENT TO RULE THEM AND THEY ESTABLISHED THE IRISH REPUBLIC WHICH WAS PROCLAIMED IN ARMS IN 1916. THE REPUBLICAN GOVERNMENT AND STATE WERE ESTABLISHED THEN OVERTHROWN BY ENGLAND AND THE NATION WAS PARTITIONED INTO TWO STATELETS. THE CARDINAL OBJECTIVE OF THE IRISH PEOPLE IS THE RESTORA-TION OF THE REPUBLIC THUS UNLAW-FULLY SUBVERTED.

The policy which Sinn F2in is pursuing in relation to what is termed "The Irish Government" is clearly defined in its National Unity and Independence Programme. Official statements issued on behalf of the Republican Movement from time to time, stress the point that a main concern of the Movement is to get the British forces of occupation out of Ireland and that use of physical force in the Twenty-Sir Counties is not contemplated.

The existing machinery of Government in Ireland was fashioned by Britain to prevent Irish people exercising their just right to the free and unfettered control of the internal affairs of the nation. Since its inception this machinery of government has functioned in accord with the interest of Britain, by whose rulers it was des-Constitutional tinkering with its basic blueprint has not, in any way fundamental to the interests of the Irish Nation, hampered or hindered its smooth functioning in conformity with the purpose for which it was created. Designed as it was to maintain the partition of the Nation's territory, and to secure her own selfish and Imperial interests, its maintainence cannot serve the cause of Ireland's Sovereign Independence, and full freedom for the Irish people will remain unaccomplished until the-machinery of Partition-Government in Ireland has been abolished.

—Monters of the Republican Movement do not seek to engage in Civil War with fellow Trishmen, and they are not taking measures to provoke civil or sectarian strife. The menace, the threatof physical strife that exists in Iretand to-day arises directly from the presence on Irish soil of armed forces of a foreign power and from the activities of Irishmen who bear arms in support of British aggressian in Ireland and British appression of Irish citizens.

It is the perpetrators of sectarian strife in Ireland, it is those who in varying-degrees help perpetrate sectarian animosities who are the real instigators of strife in Ireland, because in their respective actions and ambitions, individually and in combinations, they foster and maintain conditions which, while they exist, make peace in our land impossible.

Sending representatives to take part in the proceedings of the Westminster Institution responsible for the creation of the partition of Ireland, or to either of the partition institutions that enable Britain to perpetuate it, has not served, and as a policy cannot be made to serve in the least degree to end that evils to Ireland and her people that steen from British occupation.

Sinn Fein is not just another political party. It is a National Organisation and an integral part of the Republican Movement. Its policy and programme are determined on a basis that includes the entire territory of the Nation, and they are designed to serve the interests of all Irish citizens.

Sinn Fein appeal to al! Irishmen to "unite and survive" as opposed to the Imperial dictumof "Divide and Conquer". By doing so they will end the conditions whereby Irishmen are compelled through the stress and strain of the bad economic status to visit Britain and there to seek and plead for crumbs from the table of their Imperial rulers. While the British occupation lasts this state of affairs will prevail to the detriment of Ireland's social and economic conditions, and, it may be added, to the eternal shame and humiliation of all Irishmen.

In two previous elections within the past 12 months, a majority of the electorate in Mid-

Ulster cast their votes in sapport of my candidature as the selected standard-hearer of the Republican Movement.
