THE WHITE (WASH) PAPER AN INSULT TO THE IRISH NATION

On Tuesday March 20th White Paper presented His much talked of White Paper to the British House of Commons. To any Irish Man or Woman it is nothing but an Insult to have any British Official try to tell us how we will Govern any portion of our Country. It makes little difference to us what colour the Paper is we demand one thing and one thing only from England and that is a statement that they are prepared to make an unconditional withdrawal of all their Armed Forces from our Country and that they will stop all interference in the affairs of Our Land and Our People. Whether they make this Declaration on White Paper or on Paper Stained red Red with the Blood of their own Soldiers, make it they will have to and soon at that.

To those who were foolish enough to expect that any proposals which would bring an end to Irelands Centuries Old Fight Against British Oppression would appear in this Document the First Paragraph of it which Declares "That the Occupied Area of Ireland to be a part of the British Empire" must have proved a sad disappointment. There were no Surprises in this Document for Republicans. We of The Republican Movement have stated over and over again that when this White Paper would appear that it would in fact be an attempt to Whitewash over the True Facts which are the Root Cause of all Our Countrys Evils.

The comments of some of our Leading Free-Stat Party Politicians makes interesting Reading.. For instance Garrett Fitzgerald when asked to Comment stated "That it was a Great Step in The Right Direction". His Fore-runner in the Party of which He is a Member told us when they Signed the Treaty of Surrender that it was a "Stepping Stone" to Freedom, yet Fifty Years later Irishmen and Irishwomen are dying for that Freedom. Not one of our Free-Staters has made any comment on the demand made in this Highly Insulting Document that they give full Recognition to the British Established Assembly which it proposes to set up in our Country.

We have no doubt but Jack Lynch and His "Gang" are very pleased with the British Praise they received in this Document for the Additional Repressive Laws they introduced in 1972 to help them to Sabotage the Present Fight for Freedom. What a Pity the People who voted in the recent Free State Election did not feel the same way Jack and then you and Hatchet Man O'Malley would still be in Power.

When Republicans Gather in The Town of Fermoy on Sunday 8th April To Commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Death of General Liam Lynch, Chief of Staff Irish Republican Army shot by Free-State Soldiers on the Slopes of the Knockmealdown Mountains on April 10th 1923 they will be honouring one of Ireland's Greatest Sons.

Liam Lynch was one of the first men in North Cork to join the Ranks of The Irish Republican Army. His ready grasp of Military Matters combined with organising ability led in a very short time to his being selected to take Command of The Cork No. 2 Brigade. On His appointment to this Position he devoted all His Time and Energy to the task of organising and training his Brigade into a Highly Efficient Fighting Unit. Like all Leaders of Fighting Units of the I.R.A. then as now one of His Main Problems was to provide Arms for his men to Fight with. Like so many other I.R.A. Officers He quickly realised that the nearest Source of Supply of Arms with which to fight the British Army were those held by the British Army and so the earlier operations into which He led His men were Planned to Capture Arms and Ammunition. Most notable of these was the Capture of Mallow Barracks. This was the only British Army Barracks Successfully Captured by the I.R.A. during the years 1918-1921.

Despite the onerous duties which his position as Brigade O/C placed upon him, Liam Lynch still found time to be present with His Brigade Flying Column during all their Main Attacks on British Forces. Having avoided Death at the Hands of the British during four years of fierce fighting He was to die from a Bullet Fired by An Irish Traitor.

On the signing of the Treaty Liam Lynch immediately opposed it and devoted His full Energy to organising opposition to it. He did everything in his power to hold the Irish Republican Army as a United Fighting Force.

When it became obvious that a fight between the Army of the Republic and the Newly Established Free State was drawing near Liam Lynch did everything in his power to influence those in charge of the Free State Forces to prove to the World that they were Irishmen and not a Unit of the British Army dressed in Green Uniforms. He was actually engaged in this when the Free Staters opened fire on the Four Courts with borrowed British Guns and Gunners.

Lynch immediately Reported for Duty to the I.R.A. and took up Duty as Chief of Staff. Escaping out of Dublin City after the Four Courts Garrison was forced to Surrender, He continued to Direct the I.R.A. in Guerrilla operations against Ireland's New Enemy until that Fatal Night of April 10th 1923 when crossing the Knockmealdown Mountains with a number of other H/Q Staff Officers they were Fired on by a Free State Army Unit. When Liam Fell Wounded His Comrades attempted to carry Him over the Mountain. But He ordered them to take His Gun and Papers and to make good their Escape as He was Dying.

Eleven Years later in 1934 as a young boy I was present when the Fine Memorial erected on the spot where He Fell was unveiled by the then Chief of Staff of the I.R.A. Moss Twomey also a Corkman. Twomey had been one of the H/Q Staff Officers with General Liam Lynch the night He was shot and on the Day He unveiled the Memorial He was again "On The Run" from Free State Forces (Flame Fail Type this time).

It is a sad reflection on the Irish Nation that while we will be Commemorating the 50th Anniversary of General Lynch young Irish Soldiers of another Generation are Lying in Free State Jails because they have refused as He refused "To Stand Idly By" while British Forces still occupy our Land.

The History Of Internment
(by Gearoid Mac Carthaigh)

Many Readers who have been reading this series of Articles have asked me what we did to pass the time away while in the Camp when we were not engaged in Burning the Place Down or Digging Tunnells, So this Month I will deal with the Educational, Social, and Sporting Life of the Camp. Yes we did have all these despite the Vile Conditions we were forced to live under in this Hell on Earth, only for these activities I have no doubt we would all have ended up in Mental Homes.

Many an Internee when He was Released from the Camp was far better Educated than He had been when He first came in. We had among us some of the Highest Qualified Personell obtainable in the Field of Education. They Ranged from National School Teachers to University Professors. Classes in the following Subjects were being Run at all times.

Irish, German, French, and Spanish, Languages Mathematics, History, Geography. Singing, Book-Keeping, Electrical Engineering, and Celidhe Dancing.

I wish to make it clear to our Readers that No Assistance was given to us in our Educational Programme, all Text-Books, Copy Books, Etc. Being Provided by our own Relatives and Friends. A Military Policeman did however keep all Classes under Close Observation in case anything illegal was being taught.

At no time did we forget that we were Soldiers and that some day we would be Free again to resume the fight against British Forces of Occupation. Therefore as we had a number of First-Class Training Officers available Military Training had a Priority Place in our Daily Activities. Many Ruses had to be adopted of course to cover up our Training Classes and it is greatly to the credit of my Comrades of that Period that not one of these classes was ever caught by the "Staters". They knew they were going on of course and it drove them "Crazy" that they could not stop them. I Remember one occasion when I was brought before "The Mahoney Tribunal" Commandant Guiney Declaring "I am supposed to be Running an Internment Camp Here but you and a few more like you have turned it into a Military Training Camp." He finished up by threatening to have me Charged before the Special Military Court with Carrying on Illegal Military Training.

One thing which made it so Hard for them to catch these Classes was the Fact that No Training Officer or Volunteer being Trained was allowed to keep anything in writing. Training in the following Subjects was carried out Engineering, Organising Duties of Officers, Range-Finding, Intelligence, Work. Care and Maintenance of Weapons. Use of Weapons under various Active e Service Conditions.

Many of those who were Trained in Tintern in the Forties Played a Leading Role after their Release in Building the Army which fought the '56 Campaign. Some are now Dead But others are Playing a Active Part in the Army of the Seventies.

For Social Relaxation we had No Shortage of very fine Singers and Musicians and Sunday Evening Concerts and Concerts in our Individual Huts at night time were a Regular Part of our Life.

At Christmas 1948 we actually staged two Panto's. The first one being "Robinson Crusoe" the general story was the Standard one but the Script was Completely Re-Written to suit Local Conditions all the Jokes being Tailored to fit well known P.A.'s (Military Policemen) or Characters among our own Ranks. Phil O'Kelly of Dublin (later to become Manager in turn of both the Abbey and the Gaiety Theatres in Dublin) Played a Leading Part in this Panto. The voice of Joe Dunne of Dublin (who Played The Old Man of The Sea) with His Fine Singing of "Ill Be Up With The Lark in The Morning" has followed me in my memory ever since.

The Second Panto was Written by a Kerry School Teacher named Maurice McCurtain. It has never been Produced on any other Stage. It was known as Mc Carthys Wedding (No connection with me by the way) Playing in Leading Parts were Skipper Mahoney and Mick Mc Carthy, both from Cork.

Music for both these Shows was Provided by the Camp Orchestra which consisted of Kevin Horgan (Kerry) Piano Accordion, Sean (Hogger) Quinn, Dublin, Drummer His Drum by the way was an upturned Round Metal Wash Basin Sean Lavin (Dublin) Comp and Gearoid Mac Carthaigh (Cork) Triangle. No not "The Old Triangle" That is in Mountjoy Jail. My Triangle in the Camp was actually an Illegal Object Down There. It was made from an Iron Bar which the "Staters Claimed was a Tunnelling Tool which made it Illegal After each Performance it had to be "Dumped" for safe keeping. Conductor of the Orchestra was Mick Mc Carthy (Cork) when He was not on Stage. When Mick gave us an order to Play one listening to Him would have thought it was the Cork Volunteers Pipe Band was on the Job.

The Signature Tune was "Our Selection From The Wicked Chicken" it was essentially the Music from the Pop Tune of that time "Hail Little Hen". But there was a certain P.A. doing Duty in the Camp at the time who walked like a Chicken and we Nicknamed Him "The Wicked Chicken". I can't To-Day Remember His Correct Name. Our Signature Tune was Named by us after Him, and we always made sure To Strike it as Loud and Clear when He was Present.

Jack Rowan (Dublin) Ran a Boxing Club which was very well Patronized Good Luck to you Ned Brown (Waterford) if you see this.

Gaelic Football was another very Popular Pastime.

In our next Issue I will deal with the various Handcrafts we engaged in. The Editor will not allow me any more space in this Issue.

A New Form of Government For A New Ireland.

In The New Ireland which is about to emerge from the Sufferings of To-Day, we of Sinn Fein Visualize Many Changes for the better, but before improvements can come about the Irish People must change the System of Government which has proved a Failure in every Sphere of its activities. A form of Government which gives Power into the hands of a few to decide how the whole Population Shall Live and Die can Not be Tolerated in "The New Ireland". We Propose to scrap the present form of Government which has for over Fifty Years made the Few Richer and the Many Poorer in our Country. We propose to Replace it with a Federal System of Government as outlined in "Eire Nua" issued by Sinn Fein. In this and future issues of "An Guth" we will give a detailed account of How this form of Government will work and why we believe it is the form of Government which will bring the Greatest Possible Benefits to the whole Irish Nation.

Under The Federal System of Government Proposed by Sinn Fein Government of the Irish People will Really be by the Irish People, with the Real Power being in the Hands of The People.

As laid down in Sinn Fein's Leaflet Eire Nua. The Governmental Structure would be as follows.

A Federal Dail consisting of 150 Deputies 50 per Cent of whom would be Elected Direct to This Dail and 50 Per Cent in equal numbers from each of the Four Provincial Assemblies. These would be Dail Uladh, Dail na Munain, Dail Laighin and Dail Connacht.

Each Province as well as having its Dail would have a number of Regional Development Councils. The number of Regional Councils will vary from Province to Province depending on the Special Problems of the Province. These Regional Councils would consist of Delegates from the Community Councils within the Regional Area.

Community Councils would be set up in all areas where Large Numbers of People Reside. They would replace the Present Form of Local Government and would be Elected by all the people Resident in the Area.

The Community Council would Govern the immediate Area in which it is set up and would have Power to make Laws to deal with all matters proper to the Community which Elected it. It would have Power to Set up Parish Councils

within its own Community. These Parish Councils would Advise the Community Council on all matters Concerning the Needs and the Problems of Each Individual Parish.

The Community Council would be bound to act on all matters brought to their attention by the Parish Councils. If a Parish Council felt that its needs were not being dealt with in a reasonable manner by the Community Council, They would then have the Right to the Regional Council and if Necessary to the Provincial Council.

Four Went To A Party.

On Friday 23rd of March, Four British Army N.C.O.s were Shot in a Flat in Belfast. Three Died in that Flat and the Fourth was removed in a Critical Condition to an Un-Named Hospital.

Immediately the Propaganda Machine North and South went into Action. They were off duty Roared the British Army P.R.O. Lured to their Death in vile manner by two young Girls Echoed the Chief of the R.U.C. Every lover of British Rule in Ireland Screamed their Condemnation of the two girls and the Men who did the actual Shooting. From T/V and Newspapers. Let us stop and look at the True Facts.

A State of War exists To-Day in Occupied Ireland, this has been admitted long ago by the British Government and the British Army. So any British Soldier is liable to be Shot or otherwise Killed ~~be he~~ on Duty or Off Duty in Uniform or Out of It. This is recognised as being Legitimate under International Law. How many Off Duty German Soldiers for instance were Killed by Bombs dropped by R.A.F. Bombers on German Cities and Towns during the last World War. Of Course that was different it was the British who were doing the Killing then and They do not of Course Commit Murder, at least so they try to tell The World at Large. It is also recognized under International Law to be Perfectly Legitimate to Execute as a Spy any member of an Army found in Civilian Clothes outside His own Lines.

We do not accept for one minute the statement from the British Army that these Four were Off Duty. The People of Occupied Ireland know only too well how often British Forces Personnell both Male and Female Dressed as Civilians have come into their Areas Shooting at will and Seeking to pick up Information which could lead to the Capture of members of the I.R.A. or the Arms with which they are Playing such Havoc in the Ranks of the British Forces of Occupation. What of the Killings of Irish Men Women and Children by Uniformed British Forces these were all Regrettable Accidents of Course, British Forces do not Murder it is only the Irish who do.

Let there be no doubt about it, these Four set out on Last Friday Night with two Objectives in mind. The first being to Gather any Information they could not only from the two girls but also from any of their friends who might have been at the Party. Second they thought that they would have a nights free Fun and Pleasure at the expense of the two Innocent Irish Girls who had shown such a liking for the British Warriors.

They made but one mistake for which they Paid Dearly, they forgot that although in Ireland as in all other Countrys a Small Number of Local Traitors will be found who are willing to entertain the Invaders of their Country the Vast Majority of the Irish People Do Not want them in our Country and these two girls were of that Large Majority.

War is a Cruel and a Bitter thing and those who have to fight it have to leave aside many of the Pleasures of Life to play their part in it. So it was for these two Young Irish Girls and their Male comrades last Friday Night. War was forced on them by the Continued Occupation of our Country by British Forces, So instead of being Dancing or Enjoying life in any of the many ways that young people do they risked their all Playing their part in Irelands last Fight for Freedom. Whoever they are we Salute them as we do all the Boys and Girls of this Greatest Ever Generation Born in Ireland, and we Pledge you all our support in every way we can to end as soon as possible this War in Ireland, so that you can enjoy your young lives as you are entitled to do in a Free and Happy Ireland where Peace and Justice for all will have replaced the Sufferings and Deaths which To-Day are so much a Part of your Daily Life.

To The British Government we say Take your Troops out of our Country where they are not wanted and They Too can live and enjoy Life. While you them remain Nothing but Death is in Store for them.

John Bull's Other Navy

Scores A Victory For British Oppression.

In the Early Hours of the Morning of Thursday 29th March, John Bull's Other Navy, sometimes referred to as The Irish Free-State Naval Service, Took part in a Major Naval Operation off the South-East Coast of Ireland. As a result of which a Victory for British Oppression in Ireland was scored when the Small Coasting Vessel "Claudia" was captured and was found to have on Board a Consignment of Arms and Ammunition which were being delivered to the Forces of the Irish Republic for use against British Armed Forces in Occupied Ireland. The whole Fleet consisting of Three Minesweepers formerly Attached to The Royal Navy, plus the Latest Addition to the Fleet the Luxurious Fisheries Protection vessel built last year in Cork Dockyard At a Cost of 1 Million Pounds and Paid For With Irish Tax Payers Money, were engaged in this Dangerous Operation. Every Serving member of the Navy including those on Leave were Mobilised to take part, while Full Land Support was given by John Bull's Other Army. Sometimes referred to as The Irish h Free-State Army.

In face of this Formidable Display of Force the "Claudia" consisting of Five Men, Surrendered. Captured on Board by the Naval Boarding Party was Joe Cahill of Belfast and Two of His Comrades Sean Garvey (Kerry) and Gerald Murphy (Dungarvan) Joe Cahill it will be recalled was the man who Organised and Led the Defence of Belfast when British Forces Attacked during Internment Week August 1971. Arrested on the Orders of D. O'Malley last year he won Victory and Release by Hunger Strike. Now he faces Imprisonment under the Cosgrave-Corish Free-State Set-Up.

Following the recent Free-State Election we warned the people of Ireland and through the Pages of An Guth in the March Issue that even though the Jack-Boot had now passed from Jack The Rat (Lynch) to Willie The Weasel (Cosgrave) it would still be used against Republicans. The Action off the South-East Coast Has Proved how right we were.

Willie The Weasel Has now Proved to England how Loyal He is to Her Cause just as did His Father Willie Senior in other days. No doubt both he and his Naval Forces feel Proud of the Praise which Ted Heath lavished on them in the British House of Commons when the Glorious Victory which had been won by the Loyal Naval Forces at Helvix Head was Announced to that Assembly.

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John Bull's Other Army Played their Gallant Part in this Epiz of Naval History when they Captured the Launch with Dennis McInerney (Clare) and His two Comrades Donal Whelan and Gerrard Walsh Both of Dungarvan when they attempted to Land.

A Shy and Unassuming Man Admiral Buckshot Donegan always does His best to keep to the background, of course it is not His Fault if Those awful Press Reporters push him into the Headlines. This man whose undeniable Courage and Foresight Saved the British Empire from the Unknown Horrors which have Descended upon Her if the "Claudia" had landed Her Cargo of Arms at Helvic Head first came into the News when He Led A Land Force of Farmers in an all out Assault against an Itinerant Camp near Dunleer Co. Louth, with Shotgun Scattering Buckshot among Men Women and Children, He no doubt put an End to a Cross Border Invasion.

The Gun of Course being Licensed made the whole Operation Quite Legal, although a Local was heard to Comment in a Bar Last Thursday "Perhaps He was s only in it For The Money".

Naval History Now Has a New Name which has pushed those Well Known Leaders of the past into the Background. Nelson, Jelleco and Rader, must now give Pride of Place to "Buckshot Donegan" while "Trafalgar" and "Scape-Flow" will be but Hollow Echoes of "Helvic Head" in the "Ward-Rooms" of the World's Navy's.

It has been Reported from Reliable Sources in Dublin that Orders have been issued to the City Manager to have the Stone Structure which for many years Dominated O'Connell St. Reconstructed but it will Now be Re-Named "Donegan Pillar" and the Following Alterations will be made.

On the Base The Inscription "Trafalgar" will be Replaced with "Helvic Head" and the Figure of Nelson looking Through His Telescope across Dublin Bay with his One Eye will be Replaced with that of "Admiral Buckshot Donegan" Sitting in an Arm-Chair in Free-State Army H/Q. with Telephone in Hand Directing His Fleet while His Trusty Shot-Gun Lies across His Knees Ready to add it's Fire-Power to that of The Navy's Four Guns Should The Need Arise.

Ted Heath it is Reported will Un-Veil this Memorial, and the following will Speak. Brian Faulkner, Bill Craig, and Ian Paisley.

Navy Casualties.

Following the Battle of Helvic Head The Flagship Deirdre and The Mine Sweeper Graine Had to put into Cork Dockyard on Friday 30th March for Repairs to Damage, Caused in The Engagement.
