

Whether they make this Declaration on White Paper or on Paper Stained red Red with the Blood of their own Soldiers, make it they will have to and


soon at that.

neve all these despite the vin When Republicans Gather in The Town of Fermoy on Sunday 8th April To Commemorate the 50th Anniversary of the Death of Ceneral Liam Lynch, Chief of Staff Irish Republican Army shot by Free-State Soldiers on the Slopes of the Knockmealdown Mountains on April 10th 1923 they will be honouring one of Irelands Greatest Sons

Alghest Qualified Fersonell obtained Jacquil Liam Lynch was one of the first men in North Cork to join the Ranks of The Irish Republican Army. His ready grasp of Military Matters combined with organising ability led in a very short time to his being selected to take Command of The Cork No.2 Brigade. On His appointment to this Position he devoted all His Time and Fnerry to the task of organising and training his Brigade into a Highly Efficient Fighting Unit. Like all Leaders of Fighting Units of the I.R.A. then as now one of His Main Problems was to provide Arms for his months. provide Arms for his men to Fight with. Like so many other I.R.A. Officers He quickly realised that the nearest Source of Supply of Arms with which to fight the British Army were those held by the British Army and so the ear lier operations into which He led His men were Planned to Capture Arms and Ammunition. Most notable of these was the Capture of Mallow Barracks. This was the only British Army Barracks Successfully Captured by the I.R.A. during the years 1918-1921 tage that emure of misse

Despite the onerous duties which his position as Brig ade O/C placed upon him. Li am Lynch still fou nd time to be present with His Brigade Fly ing Column during all their Main Attacks on British Forces. Having avoi ded Death at the Hands of the British during four years of Fierce Fight ing He westo die from a Bullet Fired by An Irish Trait or he Mahomaney Tri

On the signing of the Treaty Liam Lynch immediately opposed it and devoted His full Energy to organising opposition to it. He did everything in his power to hold the Irish Republican Army as a United Fighting I'me. When it became obvious that a fight between the Army of the Republic and the Newly Establis hed FreeoState was crawing near Liam Lynch did every thing in his power to influence those in charge of the Free-State Forces to prove to the World that they were Irishmen and not a Unit of the British Army dressed in Green Uniforms. He was actually engaged in this when the Free-Staters opened fire on the Four Courts with borrowed British Gurs and Gunners to las recess to est tenogeow lo esnandal

Lynch immediately Reported for Duty to the I.R.A. and took up Duty as Chief of Staff. Escaping out of Dublin City after the Four Courts Garrison forced to Surrender; He continued to Direct the I.R.A.in Guerrilla against Irelands New Enemy until that Fatal Night of April 10th 1923 whem crossing the Knockmesldown Mountains with a number of other H/Q Staff Officers they were Fired on by a Free-State Army Unit. When Liam Fell Wounded the Knockmesldown Mountains with a number of other H/Q Staff Officers they were Fired on by a Free-State Army Unit. When Liam Fell Wounded to take His Comrades attempted to carry Him over the Mountain. But He ordered them to take His Gun and Papers and to make good their Escape as He was Dying.

Eleven Years later in 1934 as a young boy I was present when the Fine Memorial erected on the spot where He Fell was unveiled by the then Chief of Staff of the I.R.A. Moss Rwomey also a Corkman. Twomey had been one of the H/O Staff Office. the H/Q Staff Officers with General Liam Lynch the night He was short and on the Day He unveiled the Memorial Hewas again "On The Run" from Free-State Forces (Fianne Fail Type this time).

It is a sad reflection on the Irish Nation that while we will be Commen orating the 50th Anniversary of General Lynch young Irish Soldiers of another Generation are Lying in Free-State Jails because they have refused as He refused "To Stand Idly By" while By Itimh Foresard ill occupy our

Many Readers who have been reading this series of Articles have asked me what we did to pass the time away while in the Camp when we were not engaged in Burning the Place Down or Digging Tunnells, So this Month I will deal with the Educational, Social, and Sporting Tife of the Camp. Yes we did have all these despite the Vile Conditions we were forced to live under in this Hell on Earth, only for these activities I have no doubt we would all have ended up in Menbal Homes.

Mahy an Internee when He was Released from the Camp was far better Educated than He had been when He first came in. We had among us some of the Highest Qualified Personell obtainable in the Field of Education. They Rangedofrom National School Teachers to University Proffessors. Classes in the following Subjects were being Run obtail times.

Irish, German, French, and Spanish, Languages Mathematics, History, Geography. Singing, Book-Keeping. Electrical Engineering, and Celidhe Dancing.

I wish to make it clear to our Readers that No Assistance was given to us in our Educational Programme, all Text-Books, Copy Books, Etc. Being Provided by our own Relatives and Friends. A Military Palicement did however keep all Classes under Close Observation in case anything illegal was being taught.

At no time did we forget that we were Soldiers and that some day we would be Free again to resume the fight against British Forces of Occupation. Therefore as we had a number of First-Class Training Officers available Military Training haf a Priority Place in our Daily Activities. Many Ruses had to be adopted of course to cover up our Training Classes and it is greatly to the credit of my Comrades of that Period that not one of these classes was ever caught by the "Staters" They knew they were going on of course and it drove them Crazy" that they could not stop them. I Remember one occasion when I was brought before "The Mahomaney Tribunal" Commandant Guiney Declaring "I am supposed to be Running an Intermment Camp Here but you and a few more like you have turned it into a Military Training Camp. The finished up by threatening to have me Charged before the Special Military Court with Carrying on Illegal Military Training.

One thing which made it so Hard for them to catch these Classes was the Fact that No Training Officer or Volunteer being Trained was allowed to keep anything in writing. Training in the following Subjects was carried out Engineering, Organisingm Duties of Officers, Range-Finding, Intelligence,, Work. Care and Maintenance of Weapons. Use of Weapons under various Active e Service Conditions.

Many of those who were Trained in Tintown in the Forties Played a Les ling Role After their Release in Building the Army which fought the 156 campaign. Some are now Dead Fut others are Playing n Kolive Part in the Army of the Seventy's

For Social Relaxation we had No Shortage of very fine Singers and Musicians and Sunday Evening Concerts and Concerts in our Individual Huts at night time were a Regular Part of our Life.

At Christmas I942 we actually staged two Panto's. The first one being "Robinson Cruse" the general story was the Standard one but the Script was Completely Re-Writtan to suit Local Conditions all the Jokes being Tailored to fit well known P.A.'s (Military Policemen) or Characters among our own Ranks. Phil O'Kelly of Dublin (later to become Manager bit turn of both the Abbey and the Gaiety Theatres in Dublin) Played a leading Part in this Panto. The voice of Joe Dunne of Dublin (who Played The Old Man of The Sea) with His Fine Singing of "Ill Be Up With The Lark in The Morning"has followed me in my managery (1981) the stage of the Old Man of The Sea) with the Morning of the Sea of the Morning of the Mor

The Second Panto was Written by a Kerry School Teacher named Maurice McCurtain. It has never been Produced on any other Stage. It was known as Mc Carthys Wedding (No connection with me by the way) Playing in Leading Patts 1000 Skipper Mahoney and Mick Mc Carthy, both from Cork.

Music for both these Shows was Freetand by the Consisted of Kevin Horgan (Kerry) Piano Accordion, Sean (Hogger) Quitan Dublia, Drummer His Drum by the way was an upturned Round Metal Wash Basin Sean Lavin (Dublin) Comp and Gearoid Mac Carthaigh (Cork) Triangle. No not The Old Triangle That is in Mountjoy Jail. My Triangle in the Curragh was actually an Illegal Object Bown There. It was made from an Iran Bar which the Staters Claimed was a Tunnelling Thal which made it Illegal After each Performance it had to be "Dumped" for safe keeping. Conductor of the Orchestra was Mick Mc Carthy (Cork) when He was not on Stage. When Mick gave us an order to Play one listening to Him would have thought it was the Cork Volunteers Pipe Band was on the Job.

The Signature Time was "Our Selection From The Wicked Chicken" it was essentially the Music from the Pop Time of that time "Hail Little Hen". But there was a certain PRA doing Duty in the Camp at the time who walked like a Chicken and we Nicknamed Him "The Wicked Chicken". I can't To-Day Remember His Correct Name. Our Signature Tune was Named by us after Him, and we always made sure To Strike it or Lord and Clear when He was Present.

Jack Rowan (Dublin) Ran a Boxing Club which was very well Patronized Good Luck to you Ned Brown (Waterford) if you see this.

Gaelic Fortball was another very Popular Pastime.

Under The Federal System of Government Proposed by Sinn Fein Government of the Irish People will Realy be by the Irish People, with the Real Power being in the Hands of The People.

As laid down in Sinn Fein's Leaflet Eire Nua. The Governmental Structure re would be as follows.

A Federal Dail consisting of I50 Deputies 50 Ber dent of whom would be Elected Direct to This Dail and 50 Per Cent in equal numbers from each of the Four Provincial Assemblies, These would be Dail Uladh; Dail na Mumbain Dail Laighin and Dail Connacht.

Each Province as well as having its Dail would have a number of Region al Development Councils. The number of Regional Councils will vary from Province to Province depending on the Special Problems of the Province. These Regional Councils would consist of Delegates from the CommunityCouncils within the Regional Area.

Community Counsels would be set upin all areas where Large Numbers of People Reside. They would replace the Present Form of Local Government and would be Elected by all the people Resident in the Area.

The Community Council would Govern the immediate Areain which it is set up and would have Power to make Laws to deal with all matters proper to the Community which Elected it. It would have Power to Set up Parish Councils

within its own Community. These Parish Councils would Advise the Community Council omgall matters Concerning the Needs and the Problems of Each Indiv dual Parish.

The Community Council would be bound to act on all matters brought to their attention by the Parish Councils. If a Parish Council felt that its needs were not being dealt with in a reasonable manner by the Community Council, They would then have the Right to the Regional Council and if Neccessary to the Provincial Dail.

Four Went To A Party.

On Friday 23rd of March, Four British Army N.C.O.s were Shot in a Flat in BelTast. Three Died in that Flat and the Fourth was removed in a Critic al Condition to an Un-Named Hospital.

They ware off mity Roared the British Army P.R.O. Lured to their Death in vile manner by two young Girls Echoed the Chief of the R.U.C. Every lover of British Rule in Ireland Screamed their Condemnation of the two girls and the men who did the actual Shooting. From T/V and Newspapers. Let us stop and look at the True Facts.

A State of War exists To-Day in Occupied Ireland, this has been admitted long ago by the British Government and the British Army, So any British Soldier is liable to be Shot or otherwise Killed be Ra on Duty of Off Duty in Uniform or Out of It. This is recognised as being Legitimate under International Law. How many Off Duty Greman Soldiers for instance were Killed by Bombs dropped by R.A.F. Bombers on German Cities and Towns during the last World War. Of Course that was different it was the British who were doing the Killing then and They do not of Course Committ Murder, at least so they try bo tell The World at Large. It is also recognized under International Law to be Perfectly Legitimate to Execute as a Spy any member of an Army found in Civilian Clothes outside His own Lines.

We do not accept for one minute the statement from the British Army that these Four were Off Duty. The People of Occupied Ireland know only too well How often British Forces Personnell both Mallo and Famale Dressed as Civilians have come into their Areas Shooting at will and Seeking to pick up Information which could lead to the Capture of members of the I.R.A. or the Arms with which they are Playing such Havoc in the Ranks of the British Forces of Occupation. What of the Killings of Irish Men Women and Children by Uniformed British Forces these were all Regrettable Accidents of Course, British Forces do not Murder it is only the Irish who do.

Let there be no doubt about it, these Four set out on last Friday Night with two Objectives in mind. The first being to Gather any Information they could not only from the two girls but also from any of their friends who might have been at the Party. Second they thought that they would have a nights free Fun and Pleasure at the expense of the two Innocent Irish Girls who had shown such a liking for the British Warriors.

They made but one mixtake for which they Baid Dearly, they forgot that although in Ireland as in all other Countrys a Small Number of Local Trait ors will be found who are willing to entertain the Invaders of their Country the Vast Majority off the Irish People Do Not want Want them in our Country and these two girls were of that Large Majority.

War is a Cruel and a Bitter thing and things who have to fight it have to leave aside many of the Pleasures of Life to provide their part in it. So it was for these two Young Irish Girls and their Male compades last Friday Night. War was forced on them by the Continued Occupation of our Country by British Forces, So instead of being Dahcing on Enjoying Ilagin any of the many ways that young people do they risked their all Playing their part in Indiana last Fight for Freedom. > John Bulls Other Navy Scores A Victory For British Oppression.

In the Early Hours of the Morning of Thursday 29th March, John Bull's Other Navy, sometimes reffered to as The Irish Free-State Naval Service. Took part in a Major Naval Operation off the South-East Coast of Ireland. As a result of which a Victory for British Oppression in Ireland was scored when the Small Coasting Vessel "Chaudia" was captured and was found to have on Board a Consignment of Arms and Ammunition which were being delivered to the Freessof the Irish Republic for use against British Armed Forces in Occupied Ireland. The whole Fleet consisting of Three Minesweepers former ly Attached to The Royal Navy, plus the Latest Addition to the Fleet the Luxurious Fisheries Protection vessel built last year in Cork Dockyard. At a Cost of I Million Pounds and Paid For With Irish Tax Payers Money, were engaged in this Dangerous Operation. Every Serving member of the Navy including those on Leave were Mobilised to take part, while Full Land Suppp ort was given by John Bull's Other Army. Sometimes reffered to as The Irish h Free-State Army.

In face of this Formidable Display of Force the "Caudia" consisting of Five Men, Surrendered. Captured in Board byythe Naval Boarding Party was Joe Cahill of Belfast and Two of His Comrades Sean Carvey (Kerry) and Gerald Murphy (Dungarvan) Joe Cahill it will be recalled was the man who Organised and Led the Defence of Belfast when British Forces Attacked during Internment Week August 1971. Arrested on the Orders of D. O'Malley last year he won Victory and Release by Hunger Strike. Now he faces Imprisonment under the Cosgrave-Corish Free-State Set-Up.

Following the recent Free-State Flection we war ned the people of Irel and through the Pages of An Guth in the March Issue that even though the Jack-Boot had now passed from Jack The Rat (Lynch) to Willie The Weasel (Sosgrave) it would still be used against Republicans.
