

money, and may in turn be killed for money. Some men go into battle for a belief, as a means of achieving justice for their oppressed and exploited people. Sean Sabat was such a man, Sean was imbued with the noblest principles of Humanity and Justice with deep feelings for the sufferings of the oppressed people in our Country. Well meaning people have often depicted Sean as a dreamer striving for an unattainable Utopia, as an unrealistic romantic whose ideas evolved from the mystic past of Gaelic greatness, Cucullain and Tir-na-n-Og. Nothing could be further from the truth, as anyone who knew him will know, indeed a rational analysis of Sean's life work will soon dispell those notions and will clearly show that in all his activities Sean consistantly sought ways and means to break the strangle hold of foreign domination of our Country. He believed in the fundamental Principle of Irish Nationhood and the right of our people to decide their own affairs, furthermore, he advanced and was a strong advocate of the use of the Irish language in the everyday lives of the people, not just the Civil Service, or the Post Office, but by all the people especially the working classes. He believed that the preservation and encouragement of An Gaelige was vitally important to the interests of our nation and therefore our People, he saw the speaking of the language as a weapon to use against the alien, atheistic, materialistic stupar that was slowly but surely overpowering our Christian beliefs and traditional culture. The Irish language he saw as the badge of our true nationality, not in the narrow intraverted sense, but in the broad generous sense so characteristic of Sean, our own Gaelic language, and our own culture with its Christian salutations and everyday acknowledgement of the existance of God. The language he saw not as a divisive force amongst our people but as a unifying force the depths of which he believed were yet

to be realized. It must have dawned on Sean in his early years that the British connection with our Country would have to be broken if we were to achieve our freedom. He joined the ranks of many organizations in the belief that they were working for the Unity of Ireland. It was not long before Sean realised that Politicians and Hypocrites were soul mates, as he said many times: "Nil ann act caint, caint, caint." He founded his own organisation "Shadari na Saoirse" and "Giolli na Saoirse". He joined the ranks of the F.C.A. and trained himself and others in the Military Eventually Sean realised that even the F.C.A. was used not as an Army whose function would be to attack the enemies of our Country mammely the British, but rather as an instrument to preserve the dis-memberment of our Country, to preserve the status quo and to harrass those boys who had the courage to re-assert the God given right of the Irish People to their full freedom. After leaving the F.C.A. Sean became a member of the Irish Republican Army and from there on he devoted his

bringing is for the day when no would strike a blow for Trish Freedom That day came on the 12th December, Sean and his comrades attacked the British Military Installations in the Six Counties. He took part in engagements at Armagh, Lisnaskea and in the attack on Brookb-oro Barracks, Co. Fermanagh, Sean was fatally wounded, his young friend and comrade Fergal O'Hanlon also died in the battle.

It is often said that Sean's death was a terrible waste, that his talents should have been utilised in other directions, that with his marvellous powers of oratory and his great potential as a writer he would have better served the Nation as an educator. But Sean understood the problems of our Nation very clearly, and instead of chipping away at the many lesser problems that stemmed directly from the central problem, the British occupation of the Six Counties and, the economic and cultural domination of all of Ireland by that same power.

That is why Sean took up arms, and resorted to violent methods to win justice for the Irish People. Sean understood in his clear logical way the simple truth. The British Government had never responded justly to the reasoned demands of the Irish People for their right to Nation hood and Soverneignity, and that it was the right and the duty of all the Irish People to assert that right in arms and, by every other means possible.

That is the right of our people, to win for themselves that which has been denied them for centuries, the-That right was valid in 1957, when Sean Sabat fought and died for his people, it is valid to -day in 1973 when that same struggle for freedom is continued by Sean 's successors in the ranks of the Irish Republican Army.

Dr.Sicco Mansholt the outgoing President of the E.E.C. Commission has dropped a major bombshell. During a dinner party celebrating Britain's entry to Europe he said: and we quote: "That the E.E.C.has failed to fire most peoples imagination". I do not think I'm going too far that what we have done so far has not come up to European publics expectations.

He continued: "People cannot feel that what we have done is anything new, Europe has still not given a new dimension to life.

Dr. Mansholt said: "some sections industry and farmers had reaped some benefits from the developments of the last twenty years, but it is also true that the progress of integration has led to major social stresses.

"The disparaties and standards of living between different areas of the community have become more marked rather than less. For the

great has of the population this has been no broad improvement in conditions generally. This satisfaction is indeed widespread. The Norwegian Referendum came as a blunt reminder when great numbers of Norwegians simply could not see the point of what we were doing. Here he said there is a tendancy to think of the Europe of multi-national Corporations rather than the Europe of the peoples. It was not only the young and political left wingers who carped. Others to are critical, they complain that the community is undemocratic. And it is a fact that the community has developed a net work of official channels which the man in the street can make nothing of."

What Dr. Mansholt has said bears out all the misgivings and the fears of those who oppose our entry to the E.E.C.
