

The trend towards Bureaucracy has been growing steadily in Ireland ver the years. Unless some count er-system of decentralisation of a utherity be devised to put a step to bhis, then this country will en d up as a dictaborship. A beginni ng should be made at once to count eract the growing centralisation o f power. At the moment the most p ressing necessity, in the sphere . f politics is decentralisation or the conferring of authority upon s maller units of self-government. The structure of the State should not be from above downwards, but f rom below upwards, and it should b e organic and hierarchic in charac ter. All the powers of government should not be confined at one point. The way to guarantee a truely democratic society is to leave to the smaller units of Irish Society to the family, to the community, to the groups of communities in a province - all the functions which they can fullfill.

This would lead to a better community sense and the spirit of social solidarity would be developed according as the people got habituated to the exercise of authority and the control of their own local affairs. It could also spread out to wider spheres such as co-operative buying, production and marketing.

In Switzerland there are 3,000 icc al community councils in which democracy is firmly rooted. The small lest commune has only fourteen inhabitants. There is in that truly democratic country a useful precedent for Ireland, as it gives a valuable example of effective protection against a growing bureaucracy. Because each province have their own particular problems who would be better able to solve these problems other than those closest to them? Ulster which at the present is divided by partition and is see king for a solution, has been offered a solution within the framework of Dail Uladn. By creating a provincial parliament for the nine counties of Ulster, within a new Ireland, the partition system would be disestablished and the problems of the Border removed.

The Protestant people of Ulster we uld have a working majority (of approximately & million) within the Province and would have immediate access to power. That power would be the surest guarantee of their civil and religious liberty within a New Ireland.

Furthermore the devalution of power to local level would ensure for each community the opportunity to foster its own traditions and culture.

Similiarly with Connacht, a Provincial parliament could be the saving of one of the most neglected Provinces in Ireland. This Province which has one of the largest Gaelt achts, has been losing its population by a flew of emigration equalled by no other part of Ireland. To stem this flew, radical changes in the system are needed.

The Provinces of Munster and Leins ter although in a better position economically than Concacht are but he lacking in the necessary powers to create a better community spirit among the people. The develution of power from antical and to the people is the essence of democracy. The ability of the people to be involved in decision making which influences their own lives and their own particular community is the only guarantee of a practical, progressive and viable democratic system of government.
