He left the job of "Paper Chief of Staff" to an idiot from Argyle Street. Gusty is typical of the cowards who lead both the UDA and the UVF. many Protestants are Dual members, belonging to both. IRISH UNIONS

During the past three troubled years we have seen changes in every sphere of life in the 6-occupied Counties. The political arema in particular has changed beyond pre '69 recognisation, momolithic institutions like the Unionist Party, once the only voice of Protestant opinion here, have disintegrated into pieces. We have witnessed the emergence of the powerful Provisionals and their pseudo counterparts the U.D. A. New Catholic and Protestant ghettos have appeared in Belfast, the result of secterianism. one of Belfast's oldest and vilest ills. One change which has saddened many people, has been the transformation of certain Trade Unions into nothing less than political pressure groups. Men like Billy Hull have mobilised the workers in support of the policies of power mad capitalists like William Craig. Industrial action, once the main weapon in the workers armament, is no longer used as a lever for better conditions and fair wages: Instead it is used for purely political ends, mass stoppages of labour can be called at the whim of a bourgeois political hack like It is an established fact, that during the recent "black-out" caused by the walk out of workers in Power Station West, William Craig packed his German born wife off to France while he himself retired to the luxurious surroundings of the Europa Hotel. The people worst hit by the stoppage were the working class families in the slums and ghettos of Belfast, the families of the striking Power workers were, of course, in this category. The class war, which once a clearly defined case of the worker versus the capitalist landlord, bourgeosie versus proletariat, has now taken on a bizarre look in Belfast. The flagrant political misuse of the Trade Unions has made them breeding grounds for secterianism, the bosses and rackateers gloat as worker fights worker. The Irish Trade Union movement, which was NEVER Socialist, (It allowed firms like Sirocco, H & W, Ormeau Bakeries etc. to employ the work force on purely religious grounds) has now passed the point of no return and the workers must surely consider the future carefully. Prominent T.U. leaders, who have

taken a wholly one-sided stance

politically, are to blame for the

complete polarisation of opinion in the Labour movement.

When the Tories introduced Internment at the request of Brian Faulkner (a capitalist boss AND a landlord) the Trade Unions kept quiet, even though many hundreds of its members were incarcerated without a trial. When the families and friends of the innocent men went on a rent and rate strike, which was completely spontaneous although all anti-Unionist groups backed it, certain Trade Union representatives attacked the civil-disobedience campaign and called on the people to pay their rents. When a donation of £100 was offered from within the T.U. movement as a gift to alleviate the hardship caused to the families of the internees, prominent Trade Unionists caused such a stir that the gift was refused. In any other country in the world, the Unions would be at the forefront of any protests against repression of the working class, in Belfast the opposite is the case.

When one watches thousands of working men leaving their benches to march behind Billy Hull in support of the policies of a motley bunch of Capitalist leeches like Craig, Faulkner and Ardill, then the time has come for a reappraisal. The working class Trade Unions must embrace the Socialist ideal, the past three years have shown that the present leadership of the T.U. here is incapable of representing the worker. The wages and conditions of the average worker here, is far behind those of his brother in England, yet the age old war cry of the Loyalist is, "We are as much a part of Britain as Birmingham or London" unfortunately a look at comparative wage packets belies that fact.

The seemingly endless stream of new political parties springing up (Much to the delight of Britain) can be attributed directly to one point, James Connolly summed it up in his essay, INDUSTRIAL AND POLITICAL UNITY.

Everyone who has the interests of the working class at heart should strive to realise industrial unity as the solid foundation upon which alone the political unity of the workers can be built up and directed towards a revolutionary end. To this end, all those who work for industrial unionism are truly co-operating even when they least care for political activities! 5.14

EYE

The English satirical magazine, PRIVATE EYE, has the following story in the current edition.

The "Sunday People" of 1st. October reported the death of Franois Lane, a Belfast student, who was found shot dead on a patch of wasteland. The "People" quoted a police spokesman who said that the murder may have been connected with the fact that the boy's father Dr. Patrick Lane, a surgeon in the Mater Hospital, was a former British Army officer, in other words, it looked like an I.R.A. dot. None of the newspaper reports mentioned that Dr. Lane is a Catholic, whose work at the Mater Hospital often embarassed the British Army and the Northern Ireland authorities. On the 19th. August 1971, Dr. Iane wrote to the Secretary of State for Defence stating that, "with regret, and with a deep sense of shame, I wish to sever any connection I have with the British Army in view of the conduct of some members of the forces in Northern Ireland" Since then Dr. Iane has made statements which have formed the basis of the Irish Government's torture allegations against the British Government at the European Commission of Human Rights. Dr. Lane has also given evidence in many criminal cases alleging mistreatment of suspects by the Army or Special Branch in Northern Ireland. He did most of the work substantiating allegations of electric shock treatment and publicised his evidence in the press and to the BMA. FROM THE PRISON

We recieved the following press release from the Belfast Prison Comhairle Ceanstair, it was signed by the P.R.O. Gerry O'Hare.

With the gaining of political status for the Republican prisoners of 'A' Wing, Crumlin Road Prison, a massive reorganisation of Sim Fein has taken place. Before political status was granted, there was only a single Cumann with about 40 members. Since then, another 5 have been formed, each with an average membership of 24. The Cumainn are formed on an area basis, within the City boundary there are 4, another 2 cater for the rest of the Province. Here is a breakdown of the Cumainn and their names.

Two Cumainn were formed for the Belfast North-East Comhairle Ceanntair area.

No. 4 covering the New Lodge/Ardoyne/ Oldpark/Newington district is called the Rory O'Connor/David McAuley/Louis Scullion Cumann.

No. 2. covering the Ballymacarret/ Markets area is called the Tony Nolan/Joseph Fitzimmons Cumann.

The Colm Keenan/Eugene McGillen Cumann was formed for the area cover ing Antrim/Tyrone/Derry/Donegal.

The Sean Caughey Cumann was formed for to cover the Armagh/Down/Louth area.

A Comhairle Ceanntair was formed with the following Officers being elected; CHAIRMAN......Pronsias McAirt. EDUCATION OFFICER.Tony Fields. SEC/TREASURER.....John Quinn. P.R.O.Gerry O'Hare.

The Comhairle Ceanntair instructed all Cumainn to begin an immediate study of the EIRE NUA programme and encouraged the members to involve themselves more fully with the polities of Sinn Fein.

A new prison newspaper is to be started shortly, with the editorship alternating between the different Cumainn. The Cumainn will also be taking an interest in the problems of their respective areas, this will include regular articles in the local newspapers or bulletins, TATLER, PATRIOT, SAORISE, FREEDOM FIGHTER, and of course, the VOLUNTEER.



'Courts'

On Saturday last, a man was found shot in the leg near the Avoca Shopping centre. The Irish Republican Army have issued the following statement:

The local Company of the Irish Republican Army recieved a complaint that a man had been guilty of indecent exposure in the Acoca Shopping area. The complaint was throughly investigated and found to be true, the accused was given every benefit of the doubt in the course of the investigations. The seriousness of the case was added to by the age of the girl who was involved, she was only a schoolchild.

The VOLUNTEER has always realised the shortcomings of punishment of offenders by the I.R.A. Unfortunately there is little alternative at the moment, the ideal solution would be "Peoples Courts" where local people could be called on as jurors, where a legal expert could judge the case, and where the accused could engage a solisitor.

The NRM, the P.D. and Sinn Fein all looked at the possibility of peoples courts, unfortunately the time is not yet right for the implementation of such an idea. In the meantime, there are two choices, either you hand over anyone guilty of serdous crimes to the R.U.C., or you rely on the Irish Republican Army to apprehend, try, and punish them. The person who was shot on Saturday would have been sent to Crumlin Rd. Jail, where he would have been kept in solitary topretect him from the other prisoners. As well as that, his name and address would have been plastered all over the news media.

The present method of punishing offenders is, of course, unsatisfactory, but until someone comes up with a better idea, there is
