I.R.A. BOMB FNGLAND

THE REPUBLICAN people feel the growing political power of resurgent IRA activity, given the recent raising of the struggle at home, and now the re-opening up of a war front in England. Whether the enemy likes it or not international attention is being focussed on the British occupation of Ireland, and hopefully this extension of the struggle will provoke debate on Ireland by the working-class of the colonial power.

The Brits certainly don't understand Irish patriotism or appreciate the often tacit nature of the IRA's support. Only a revolutionary nationalist organisation based on the support of the oppressed people can successfully perform the regroupings periodically necessary to combat Brit killings, arrests and jailings. Only a People's Army can fight a ten year war!

The IRA's recent de-claration of continuous struggle and "no ceasefire" was immediately followed by commercial bombings which once again rocked

the six-county statelet to its foundation. (Traders in Armagh had the securitybarriers re-erected after the car bomb explosion. It was the first serious reversal of counter-insurgency "normalisation" policy.)

Then came the execution of the H-Block 'Commandant', Albert Miles; the attacks on screws, the bombings in England, and back in Belfast the killing of a soldier and the blowing up of an RUC sergeant last Tuesday.

The British state and the 'Northern Ireland Office' must feel totally demoralised at this point in time. And us?

We go into 1979 with a new feeling of prestige and future success!

In a supplied statement the Irish Republican Army declared:

"To the English people-"We were responsible for the widespread bombing attacks in your country on Sunday and Monday morning. Don't remain complacent because of the nature of these attacks. We deliberately choose the time and the targets. Your intelligence will continue to give us, logproblems which.

however, we believe we can overcome. We now give due warning to you, the English people, that in future both the targets and the timing might be changed.

"For 10 years our people have suffered under your Army and despite the propaganda misrepresentations of successive Governments, we have exercised considerable restraint. We now ask you: who are we to hold accountable for British murder in Ireland? And we warn you, almost certainly we will gear the severity of our future attacks to the performance of British soldiers and the British administration in occupied Ireland. Furthermore, any acts of brutality against defenceless prisoners of war would inevitably force us into considering inflicting heavy civilian casualties.

GERMAN **BOMBS**

Last August eight bombs ex-ploded in co-ordinated I.R.A. at-tacks on British Rhine Army bas-es in West Germany. The targets were Brit barracks, repair work-shops and officers' clubs.

At just after 11 p.m. on Fri-day 18th August six bombs went off within six minutes of each other at barracks in Moenchen-gladbach and in nearby Dussel-dorf

dorf.

An hour later two more bombs exploded at repair workshops in Minden and nisted Moss Bank Barracks, Bielefeld, some 120 miles to the north-east of the first targets.

The surprised Brits were left scratching their heads, examining what they admitted to be "extensive damage" and wondering how their super-efficient "security" systems had been breached.

"We salute all our brothers and sisters on the courageous spirit you have shown under the most repressive conditions. There can never be a compromise from us on the aims and objects of the struggle - Brits Out and national liberation. This is a war of attrition. It will be long and hard, But it will be victorious!

AS OUR COLUMNIST, THE 'BRIGADIER', OFTEN WRITES: "The Security Forces had a bad week last week". On this occasion that sentence could be described as the understate-

AS OUR COLUMNIST, THE 'BRIGADIER', OFTEN WRITES: "The Security Forces had a bad week last week". On this occasion that sentence could be described as the understatement of the year. The RUC probably had the most embarrassing week in their 56 years sectarian history with eight of their members being arrested and held at their own torture head-quarters at Castlereagh.

News broke of the first arrests (after the media slavishly agreed to a 24 hour embargo on reporting the arrests). On Thursday December 14th an RUC Sergeant, his parents and an RUC. Constable were reported to be being questioned about the kidnapping in June of Amoghill Parish Priest, Father Murphy, and the murder of William Strathearn, a Catholic greengrocer, also from Amoghill, in October 1972.

Further arrests followed during the week and by the weekend eight RUC men were being held by their comrades in Castle-

Last Monday two RUC sergeants and one constable appeared in a Belfast court charged with murder and kidnapping. Before the court was John Weir (sergeant) Gary Armstrong (sergeant) and William McCaughey (constable). The five other RUC men were still in custody being questioned about other sectarian outrages.

These attacks include the attempted assassination of leading Belfast Republican,

Kevin Hannaway, earlier this year. At the time 'Republican News' pointed to the likely involvement of members of Her Majesty's 'security forces'.

BRITS ALSO

Last week wasn't a very good week for the Brits either. Shortly after the news broke of the RUC men being arrested it was announced that ten Brits based in the Grand Central Barracks in Belfast's city centre were expected to be charged with theft from postal workers in Belfast's Churchill House. Apparently the RUC had installed hidden cameras in the building because of earlier thefts and had caught their fellow 'law and orders' men red-handed.

Before the weekend was over reports about two more Brits being arrested and questioned in Scotland in connection with a double murder of two Catholic County Fermanagh farmers were confirmed after the story appeared in the Scottish 'Sunday Maril'.

The 'Mail' reported that a

former member of the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders walked into an Edinburgh police station and volunteered a statement of admitting involvement in the murders,

The murders occurred in October 1972 near Newtown-butler, County Fermangh. Those murdered were two farmers, Michael Naan aged 31 and Andrew Murray, 24, a leading member of the local area branch of the Civil Rights Association. The victims' bodies were so badly mutilated that the murders became known locally as the 'pitch-fork' murders.

At the moment the question uppermost in the minds of most of the Nationalist people is why are the Brits engaged in seemingly purging the ranks of the RUC.

TORTURE TRIO

One argument put is that the RUC's boss Newman is vigorously pursuing his plan of reforming the RUC and these arrests are examples of his sincerity.

No doubt the torture trio Mason, Newman and Creasy would like the Nationalist people to believe the RUC is reformable and thus accept the RUC back into their areas.

But the recent charging of RUC men and Brits will do little to enhance the normalisation programme the Brits are engaged in, The charges especially against the RUC men will further alienate the Nationalist community by confirming their long held suspicions that there is little significant difference between the sectarian murderers of the U.V.F. and the RUC.

A FINE BUNCH

The recent claims Newman that his men are a "fine bunch of officers" and that they wouldn't engage in any untoward activity like torturing wouldn't people, will ring hollow against the latest background of murder and kidnapping; as will denials made by the RUC over the killing of Brian Maguire in Castlereagh and the kidnapping of IRA Volunteer Jackie McMahon (Jackie McMahon of Short Strand was arrested by the RUC in January of this year was found drowned in the River three months later.). The practical explanation for these recent charges is simple. In each case it would have been more difficult to cover-up the involvement of the RUC and Brits because their actions had already become public knowledge (on at least a limited scale).

In the case of the RUC men; they were only arrested when their sectarian activities became public knowledge locally in Fermanaph. One of the RUC men's wives had apparently spread the word that her husband was involved in the murder of Strathearn and the kidnapping of Murphy. The RUC had no option but to act against their own, and thus expose the tip of an iceberg of RUC corruption and sectarian gangsterism.

Similarly in the case of the Argyll and Sutherland High-landers, the Brits couldn't possibly draw a veil of silence over the circumstances surrounding the murders of the farmers because one Brit admitted his part.

Likewise with the arrest of the ten light fingered 'Grand Central' Brits, the RUC have their activities on film, and have little option but to pursue the case.

IN SUPPLIED statements the Irish Republican Army claimed responsibility for the following operations:

Towards the end of last week further I.R.A. letter bombs exploded in the greater Belfast area en route to screws homes. The screw machine-gunned by the IRA on Monday 11th December at the corner of Carlisle Circus on the Crumlin Belfast, died on Road. Thursday 14th. Meanwhile complained Paisley bitterly about the need to bolster the screws flagging morale by providing them with additional 'security'. He said that already two senior screws had resigned and that others would follow. An IRA spokesman pointed out that any screws who do resign should not hesistate in forwarding on to them news of their resignation to ensure their future safety.

WAR NEWS

Thurs, Dec. 14th DUNGANNON

Dungannon Golf Club was badly damaged yet again in a fire started by three explosions. This is the third time the club was successfully bombed. In claiming responsibility for the attack the IRA warned: "This is Mason's Christmas box, and it's still a long time to Christmas!"

COOKSTOWN

A bomb exploded in the Tavern Bar, Carvanagh, singeing nearby Brit bomb 'experts'. An adequate

warning had been given and there were no civilian casualties.

Fri. Dec. 15th BALLYKELLY

A hoax bomb was planted during the evening in the town's business centre, causing serious traffic disruption.

OMAGH

A bomb placed on an earth-remover the previous night caused the main Omagh-Cookstown road to be closed for several hours. During the morning.

Sat. Dec. 16th

A bomb exploded in O'Hares builders yard causing widespread damage.

Sun. Dec. 17th

Britain

In a co-ordinated bombing offensive IRA active service units planted bombs in six major English cities, including London.

In a 24 hour period from Sunday nine bombs went off in London, Bristol, Manchester, Liverpool, Coventry and Southampton.

Hundreds of thousands of pounds worth of damage was caused to commercial property. The further damage to Mason's sinking morale and to his standing amongst his colleagues was not recorded.

ALTHOUGH THE present troubles' began in 1968 own involvement began in 1971. Ten to four on the morning of 7th December 1971 was the first time British soldiers raided our home, in Andersonstown. The door was banged and in came the Brits and arrested husband and two friends. They were taken to Palace Barracks, Holywood and held for three days.

ESCAPE

They were then interned on the prison ship "Maidstone" in Belfast Lough. Only 13 days later the three of them together with four other men escaped by swimming across the lough.

At this time I was expecting my fourth child who was born on the 3rd March 1972, My husband, who had been in Dublin until a week before our child was born, was again arrested.

On the 28th August he was charged by the RUC with escaping from 'legal custody'.

After 10 months on remand was brought to court and given a seven month sentence. He walked free from the court, having served 10 months, straight into the arms of the RUC Special Branch who arrested him yet again. After three days interrogation at Castlereagh he was in terned on the 23rd June 1973. He was held at Long Kesh, until his release on December 5th over two years later.

He was one of the last intern-

ees to be released.

DISRUPTED LIFE

All the time my husband was in gaol I had the task of looking after our four children, After being released from internment he was at home for two years, but was unable to live a normal life because of continual harassment by the British army and RUC. They took him to Castlereagh numerous times and held for either 3 or 7 days

All this had a very bad effect

Our nerves were wrecked wondering when the Brits/RUC would come again for him, I felt every time he was arrested, this time he won't be coming back. The last time they came, was 4th February of this year.

By now, I was expecting our fifth baby.

The house was raided by the Brits/RUC, they held him for three days and then charged him with Possessing Ammunition in January 1977, one year before his arrest

DEPRIVED

I was wrecked, I thought I would not be able to go on having our baby on my own again, I felt it was all too much; going to visit him in Crumlin Gaol, coping at home with the other children. It's very hard to divide one's attention between and then between five children when the new baby was born.

I know our children are miss ing out a lot of loving that their daddy would take the greatest

THE WAITING **YEARS**

THIS ARTICLE is based on an interview with Ann Gorman, a 29 year old mother of five from Anderstonstown, Belfast.

In early November her husband Tommy was sentenced to three years imprisonment on a fabricated charge of possessing ammunition. He is now "on the blanket" in H4 Block, Long

Prior to his present imprisonment he was in gaol on three separate occasions, interned twice and 'on remand' once.

Anne talks about her life on the outside of the wire. It is a moving account of personal hardship which she, like many hundreds of other wives and mothers, has courageously endured in the fight for Irish independence. Her story is of interest, not because it is unique but because it is so typical.

delight in giving them. He loves all his children very much, It's not the easiest thing to display on a half hour visit to a prison. how much you care for them all and I know that it bothers him very much. He doesn't want our children growing up thinking their daddy doesn't love them.

While husbands are in prison wives and children live on 'Supplementary Benefits'. We are giv

en what the state thinks we should be living on for a family of six. From this amount I am expected to clothe and feed myself, my children, pay my rates, rent, electricity and gas bills. It's quite a problem to stretch the money to cover these expenses. For instance, new clothes, shoes, records and other similar things are a luxury our children would get only at Christmas

What bothers me a lot is the attitude of the 'visitor' from "Supplementary Benefits" who calls to see if there is any change in my circumstances. I feel belittled, like a beggar, yet it's hardly my or my husband's fault that he cannot work to keep our

HOPES DASHED

Since my husbands trial when he was found guilty on the perjured evidence of two British soldiers and sentenced to three years, I can't really explain how I feel, not even to myself.

When he was on remand I had hopes that when he came to trial he would be released, as the evidence was so flimsy. I should've realised that this is Ireland, an invaded island. You just shouldn't expect justice.

ON THE BLANKET

Tommy went on the blanket protest, the day he was sentenced. Although that was only several weeks ago his appearance is frightening but his spirits are very high. I am behind by husnd in this step he has taken.

I would never expect him to recognise himself as a criminal, Wearing prison clothes is only one aspect of it all. It's really the principle behind the "Garb". Once a political prisoner wears a "monkey-suit", as my husband calls it, there is no point in the war that is going on.

No Republican in H-Block did anything that would benefit themselves materially. Their actions are designed to bring about a situation whereby a better society can be built for us and our children. I firmly believe in political status for political offenc-

Visiting Long Kesh is a nightmare. The effects before a visit, during the visit and after it are traumatic. My husband receives

one visit per month. He is allowed three adults and two children

CRIED TO SLEEP

We have five children, but the screws regard my two eldest as adults. That leaves three children; I am allowed two on the visit. This means that one of my children must stay at home. How do I choose which child has to remain at home? My husband wants to see the youngest baby, monthly, to keep track on his progress. My fourth girl who was the baby for six years is very close to her daddy. Laura, who is close to me had to be the one to stay at home this month.

The night before the visit she cried herself to sleep. She was thinking about her daddy and how cold he was with only a blanket around him. Needless to say this upset me very much. The monthly visits are terrible. The small waiting room is always packed, smoke everywhere, because people are so upset they smoke twice as much; the degrading searches you have to endure to get your visit are horrendous. This search procedure also applies to my children.

HEARTBREAKING

where my husband is brought in. looking like someone found in a desert, lost for years, the atmosphere is very cold and imperson-You enjoy absolutely no privacy during your visit. A screw stands beside us looking at us and listening to our conversat-

The visit is our only communication because the men are not allowed letters. You try to pack into half an hour's visit how you feel but trying to hide your shock and revulsion of the whole thing is difficult. Saying goodbye and watching the children kissing their daddy is heartbreak-

CHRISTMAS

With Christmas coming up and knowing we won't see him until after the New Year is more than I can endure. For the children you have to put up a Christmas tree and decorations and try to go on as if everything is alright but it's very hard when you feel so bad. You wouldn't care if you never had another Christmas again until their Daddy

What more can I say, only that my husband will see the end of it all in 3 years?

What of the young men doing life and longer sentences, some 30 years? How must they and their families feel?
