
The revelations that research data gathered by undergraduates, graduates and rese ' fellows etc. at the New Unive y of Ulster is being used by the British Army and the RUC in their campaign of repression against the nationalist population of the North is a devastating indictment against academic bureaucrats. BRITAIN has been plunged into debate recently over the question of abortion. On one side stand those who claim to support life in every form. Like right wing the Catholic conservatives. Church and the National Front whose respect for life does not

At present the 1967 Abortion Act allows abortion where birth would result in physical or mental injury to the mother's health. Under the new bill - which looks unlikely to get through given the level of popular opposition outside parliament — a woman would have to establish that childbirth would result in 'substantial' damage to her health (one can only wonder about the difference between damage and

The row in Britain highlights the almost total silence and hypocrisy on the subject in this country. For according to legal and medical opinion there is nothing to talk about. Much less do. But the reality is that thousands of Irish women travel to Britain each year for abortions. People may abhor such a phenomenon but they cannot in all honesty ignore it. The absence of a freely available contra-ceptive service does not mean that people's sexual urges appear - even in Holy Ireland. Thousands of unwanted pregnancies, spoilt young lives, cripplingly large families and u 1 mothers are the result of

such official ignorance and deprivation. No man can experience or understand the feeling of pregnancy; wanted or unwanted. And no man has the right to be the ultimate arbiter as to whether a woman makes such a choice.

COMMENT ON STATEMENT

In relation to the statement of the Derry Brigade of the Irish National Liberation Army, our Derry correspondent after some enquiries confirmed the existence of the documents referred to in the press release. His report is as follows:

After I had been informed of the contents of the INLA statement, with the help of some friends, I made contact with a member of the Staff of the Derry Brigade. Upon informing him of my reasons for meeting him, we arranged another rendezvous three days later in a suburban part of the city. I was eventually driven to a house in that area of Derry and introduced to two people, of whom was referred to as the Brigade P.R.O. and the other whom I knew to be a lecturer at the New University of Ulster. After some discussion about the contents of the press statement I was shown a photo-copy of docu-ments which I believe to be authentic and which support the allegations contained in the press

MEDIA BURIED STORY

The Brigade PRO informed me that these allegations had been refused publication in every newspaper that they had been forarded to. He also stated that one local newspaper editor had contacted the RUC and the British Army on receipt of the statement.

I then requested a loan of the photo-copy for use in the 'Starry Plough' but the lecturer informed me that publication of the copy would lead, owing to markings on the document, to the betrayal of its source. Loss of employment and the threat of prosecution pre-vented the source from identifying him/herself.

ICE-CHANCELLOR SIGNED DOCUMENT

I AM AT LIBERTY however to state that the agreement to 'provide' information to the RUC and the British Army is not a recent development. One signature on the document is that of a past vice-Chancellor of the of a past vice-Chancellor of the University, Alan Burgess. The documents are headed 'CONFI-DENTIAL' and are associated with the academic Council and Deans of the University. The present Chancellor, Dr. W. H. Cockcroft, must be aware of the agreement. My informant believes that all Deans and members of the Academic Council are narty to the Academic Council are party to the secret arrangement.

FINGERPRINTS

The fingerprint scandal, which rocked Dublin Castle, a year ago is not the first example of the 'mistaken' identification of exhibits by the Forensic Bureau. Sean McBride stated in the aftermath of the Fingerprint Scandal

forensic science himself because he had come to realise thet the "expert" advice was so unreliable. The "experts" were unable to do so, and a jury acquitted the men. McBride also experted the text. quitted the men. McBride also ex-posed the standards used by the Gardai in the Free State. The Gardai look for 8 points of similarity between the prints they find at the scene of a crime and

FORENSIC

The Gardai are looking to the British use of "forensic evidence," at a time when the British forensic frame-ups are being increasingly exposed. The swab test used to convict two Irishmen, William Power and Patrick Hill, of the Birmingham bombings has now been called into question by the Nuclear Research Centre. The simple 19th century test used on the men would have given a positive result for nitrates had the men handled cigarettes! Yet the expert" witness in the case was 99% positive that his outdated and extremely broad test was conclusive proof against the men.

IS LEITRIM LOST?

The Irish Republican Socialist Party took a firm stand in June 1979 in opposing the closure of Donnelly's factory in the Coombe. At that time, the IRSP warned that the Donnelly closure was the first step in the collapse of the traditional bacon industry in the 26 Counties. This warning has now unfortunately been proved correct with the downfall of the McCartin Brothers Group in

Donnelly workers argued in the face of redundancies that their factory was viable since it had made a profit the previous year. The parent company Clover Meats Co-Op had decided to pay off the work-force because they wanted to sell-off the valuable site in Dublin's Inner City. Donnelly workers were adamant that an explanation of recent Clover Meat losses could be found among some of the rapidly deserting directors of the Co-Op.

Give and Take! MICHAEL COLLINS was Chief Executive of Clover Meats Co-Op when it undertook to guarantee McCartin loans from the ACC for the building of a piggery in 1975. Collins resigned from Clover Meats in 1977 to take over as Chairman of the ACC. Collins is therefore in the

unique position of calling in loans which he himself guaranteed!
Collins' role in putting
McCartins into Receivership is, to say the least, suspect. In view of the Donnelly workers allegations of misappropriation of funds within Clover Meats and the McCartin's assertion that Collins acted as a paid director of their Companies for a time, then it is clear that the role of the ACC boss - the State farming bank is now in question.

Clover Meats guaranteed the McCartin loan on the under-standing that the brothers would supply 50% of the needs of Donnelly's factory. The cost of that supply became a source of dispute. In order to buy McCartin pigs, Donnellys had to pay a levy to the Pigs and Bacon Commission. Donnelly workers themselves explained that the system was unprofitable, because smaller uncontrolled saus-

age factories bought their pigs from stocks which had been smuggled across the Border and therefore were able to undercut Donnelly prices in the shops. The McCartins lost their markets for pigs when Donnellys was closed. The events in the Liberties last summer spelt the end for the Leitrim piggery.

An Irish Industrial Revolution.

The 3,000 jobs lost in Donnellys in June had a crippling effect on an already declining Inner City. The loss of 350 jobs in Leitrim will have even more drastic consequences. Such a loss will lead to the inevitable depopulation of that county. Leitrim is, and always has been, the most desolate and neglected county on this island. The stoneage landscape around the Arigna coalmiles is scarred with broken cottages, grim reminders of those departed on the emigrant boat. The countryside in Leitrim today is still as bleak and barren as it was after the Great Famine. Leitrim has always been abandoned by politicians as a lost cause. It is not surprising then that to the people of the county the McCartin brothers are heroes. They created an econ-omic miracle by marrying a

decayed rural area to modern industrial methods, and they made it flourish. An Foras Taluntais reported — after the announcement that a Receiver had been sent in — that the proposed piggery was the most impressive one of its kind and they argued that it was profitable. The solidarity behind the brothers in Leitrim is absolute. Their workers do not regard them as mere slick bosses, but are prepared to defend the companies assetts with shot-dguns!

panies assets with shot-guns! The issue is not just 350 jobs, it's the survival of a community. The people of Leitrim have been denied too much for too long to surrender lightly the gains of the past decade

It is only in the homes of Belfast, Derry, Armagh and in their Derry, Armagh and in their mothers hearts that the depths of blanketmens suffering is understood.

IN OTHER TIMES

For some reason the human race seems to understand horror more clearly when it looks back on it. To-day the names of Dachau and Auswitz are monumental reminders of man's evil to man, but in 1945 those names man, but in 1945 those names were simply disquietening rumours which people banished from their minds. So it is with H-Block to-day. There is not an Irishman or woman in 1980 who is not aware of the uffering that Irish Fenians endured in English prisons at the end of the last century. These same people might disagree with the liberation struggle in the North but they are quick to condemn the penal and barbaric conditions inflicted on the Fenians in other times, Ireland holds the Fenian graves now but the same torture goes on for another generation-and the majority stand silent.

O'Donovan Rossa ate his food like an animal off the floor, his arms chained to the wall behind him. Irishmen were hitched to nim. Instanted to treadmills in Dartmoor prison and many of them were ground to living dust by the anguish. The motto over the entrance to Dartmoor was "Abandon hope, All ye Who Enter Here". 

TO SUPPORT IRISH POLITICAL PRISONERS

LETTER FROM BLANKETMEN

Sir - No doubt over these past few years and especially in recent months you have all become familiar with the terms of H-Block and "blanketmen". Undoubtedly you all know that H-Block is the name of the prison in which the "blanketmen" are being held, but do any of you know of the true living conditions within this prison and of the treatment meted out to the "blanketmen"? No? Well, let one here

treatment meted out to the "bianketmen"? No? Well, let one here try, in this brief note, to bring to you H-Block.
Firstly, picture in your head, a "tomb", a cold grey box of concrete just like the tombs in your own city cemetery. Picture this "tomb" with a window. Only in the window have a large metal grille, surrounded by a wooden bar-like structure with inserted fibre-glass panels.

Now in your dull "tomb" look at all of the walls covered in human excreta and rotten food, your floor littered with decaying food, soiled

excreta and rotten 1000, your noor intered with decaying 1000, soiled paper and splashed with pools of urine and water.

As you picture the cell imagine the smell, the unberable stink of old moulded food, excrement and urine. Along with the stink, feel the cold as it pierces your white body as you try to cover yourself with a smelly, damp-soaked blanket.

Have you got this "tomb-like cell" in your head? Add a "blanket-

Furniture - a large damp lump of smelly foam his bed; ragged pieces of coarse cloth which serves as his blanket; a plastic chamber pot and an

or coarse croth which serves as his bianket; a plastic chamber pot and an old dirty, filthy water gallon from which two men have to drink. With this "cell" pictured in your head think now of the young men who languish and rot there, young men, now old men, with long grimy shaggy hair, sunken eyes, matted beards, rotten teeth and their bodies aching from hunger, cold and endless beatings, beatings which occur

aching from hunger, cold and endiess beatings, beatings which occur daily during cell searches, wing shifts and coming and going on visit. Along with the beatings the "blanketmen" have to undergo the most inhuman degrading search which consists of firstly, the naked "blanket-man" being forced into a spread-eagle position over a large mirror, then he is kicked and thumped down into a squatting position, the mirror is then raised up to his buttocks, probing fingers prise his buttocks apart and a large torch and metal detector are used in a thorough search of his anal passage.

With this part of the search complete, he is dragged up by the hair, and in front of 4 or 5 screws his nose, mouth, ears, hair, penis, testicles and pubic hair are thoroughly searched.

We hope that through this short note we've put the true picture of life inside 'H-Block' for 360 "blanketmen" in your mine. Could you life inside 'H-Block' for 360 "blanketmen" in your mine. imagine what it would be like for these men to be able to smoke a

cigarette, hear a tune on the radio, read a morning paper, write a letter to either their families or girl friends. Just these the small natural things of life have been denied to thsee man for over three years now and will go on being denied. The endless suffering and beating and inhuman treatment will continue unless you speak out now and tell the world the truth and help stop it all.

We the "blanketmen", write this letter to you, begging you to help us now before it is too late, before some mother's heart is broken with the news of her son's death in H-Block.

SUFFER LITTLE CHILDREN

The Proclamation of 1916 promised to cherish all the children of the nation equally. It is a promise that no Free State Government has upheld. But it is not just the Quisling politicians who have betrayed that ideal, In who have betrayed that the action a country which applies the letter of Catholicism so rigidly it is blatant hypocrisy to see the spirit of Christianity applied so miserably. In no case is this more obvious than in the plight of the travelling people and their children who are often the victims of the most cruel neglect. Indeed it is ironic to note that travellers have begun to emigrate to sites in England where they are more protected by Race and Anti Discrimination legislation than they are in their homeland.

There are only two counties in the country which can claim a truely honourable record in their dealings with travellers, and those counties are Wexford. Wicklow

TRADITION

The travellers have a long tra-dition of respect for Wicklow and Wexford. It is here that they marry their daughters and it is in the graveyards from Bray to Wexford Town that they bury their travellers return every spring to these graveyards, carry ing flowers, to join in the "paidiring' service – a ceremony which takes its name from the Irish 'paidir', prayer, and is a mixture of Catholic ritual and pagan festival. There has always been a

In these homes, they have their letters read and written. By tradition, they gather in certain friendly pubs where they will hear news of their own kin and 'leave word' for others. Over the past fifty years, many have set-tled in towns along the South-East coast, and it is no shame to mention that there are families in Bray, Gorey and Wexford Town who are bearers of noble names.

It is as a result of this tradition of hospitality and good-will that over the past ten years, site servicing, re-settlement, special schools and training units for travellers have been established in and around Bray. These improvements have now come under threat.

VICTIMIZATION

Travellers in South Co. Dublin have in recent weeks been forcibly moved off sites in the area. Other families still living in the Bray and Ballybrack areas are being pres surised to go. Co. Council lorries have taken to tipping rubbish on to one site, making it inaccessible to those who live there. This is a deliberate and vindictive campaign which will undo all the

good of recent years.

The victimization has two im mediate results. Firstly the family must move out, thereby losing its place on the housing

Secondly, with the family again on the road, the children are unable to attend the Special School, in Bray. Dept. of Education bureaucracy ensures that if the children live beyond a certain limit from the school when they are ineligible for transport to the

To-days travellers are very anxious that their children should be able to read and write. They understand, better than most, some of the less obvious dangers some of the less obvious dangers of illiteracy. One traveller man, for example, was prosecuted for hitching his horse to a 'No Parking' sign, even though he was ignorant of the meaning of the sign. Teenage travellers take delight in going to the cinema, where they watch with awe and envy the trappings of a richer world, Many of these would avail of industrial training if a course of industrial training if a course which suited their needs was provided for them. The callous and mercenary actions of the local authorities indicate their lack of concern for travellers.

The travelling people are Irish citizens and are an historic part of citizens and are an instone part of the Irish nation. The settled community very often only chooses to see the worse aspects of traveller life, the alcoholism, the begging the fights. The reason for this is that the poorest and most oppressed travellers now live in the big towns and cities where family structure which supports all travellers has broken



THE OTHER SIDE

How many of the settled population have bothered to inform themselves of the other side of traveller life? How many settled people know that the life expectancy of a traveller man is 34 years? That a traveller woman will be married and have four children by the time she is twenty? That one in four traveller babies will die in infancy? Despite the hard-ship and the deprivations of their lives travellers remain very independent and optimistic people. They retain their own culture and customs, their own language, and their own-very strict-moral codes. The travellers do not want to abandon their

own way of life, rather they want to be allowed to live it in good health and with dignity.

The people of Wicklow and Wexford have long understood that the travellers were different. To their credit, they have been able to accept that being different from a settled person was not synonymous with being inferior. For generations travellers have suffered at the hands of the authorities and from the narrow and sanctimonious attitudes of selfish citizens. Let it be in Bray then that settled people recognise their responsibility in this matter and make a stand for travellers rights. Keep the school for the children open

Housing Conference

A one day conference organised by the Dublin Housing Action Committee was held on February 16th in Liberty Hall. The conference was chaired by Mick Rafferty, a community worker based in the inner city. Rafferty explained that the Committee had been formed following the imprisonment of Fergus McCabe, a social worker, on charges arising out of a housing demonstration last year. The Committee comprised of social workers, political groups, voluntary organisations and student bodies.

The emphasis on research reflects in part the nature of the audience. Lawyers architects, economists, social workers, research workers and community workers, together with a few City Councillors, all people with a declared interest in community politics made up at least half the 200 strong audience.

Pat Carroll, the Labour Councillor, asked for clarification of the term "community" pointed out, no community is homogeneous, containing as it does differing interest groups and individuals with varying political ideologies. The point was well made, but unfortunately no debate followed it.

It would have been illuminating, however, to hear NATO's Matt Larkin, in the light of his experience, discuss or dispute tactics and a way forward with this fledgling Committee.

POLITICAL ROLE?

Mick Rafferty was at pains to point out that the new Committee was anxious to distinguish itself from the Dublin Housing Action the Committee of the early Seventies, and did not want to assume political overtones.

Again the emphasis on research must be seen in this light.

PRESS STATEMENT

The Tories are saying "Join Up" or starve.

BAR THEM

The Irish Republican Socialist Party calls on the School Committee of Claudy Secondary School to prohibit im-mediately the recruitment of young men and women from their classes to the ranks of the RUC. We call on the nationalist population of the area to ensure that your children do not attend these recruitment classes and to force the School Cosimittee to bar enemy personnel from the school premises.

The Conterence divided into four groups to discuss (i) land prices and control, (ii) a state building programme, (iii) recognition of the community dimension in development schemes and (iv) a charter of rights for

Whatever the views of the newly elected Committee members, there were veterans of the old Dublin Housing Action Committee and the Dun Laoire Housing Action Committee in the audience who visibly ached for the militancy of the mass demonstrations of a decade ago.

As one City Councillor remarked privately, "It's all a bit academic, isn't it?"

campaign THE LOYALIST FORCES This nurderous campaign is being waged covertly by Smith's redundant Rhodesian Army and openly by Muzorewa's auxiliaries. nese auxiliaries have retained their weapons under the Ceasefire and to-gether with the Commonwealth forces are acting as 'custodians' of the Patriotic Front guerrillas who have entered the ceasefire camps + + + 'auxiliaries were recruited during the war from among the most reactionary sections of the nationalist population. Their role was to guard the "Protected Villages" where 600,000 Zimbabweans where imprisoned during the war. The Auxiliaries methods of protection were killings, torture, beatings, looting, rape and starva-

The Smith-Muzorewa regime established the Auxiliaries transitory means by which Black Africans could be drafted into the Rhodesian Army - Smith refers to them as "our blacks". The Auxiliaries are the willing agents of their racist mastersthey continue to undermine attack the Zimbabwean people with the full acquisence of their Brit. Allies.

IRISH LESSONS

An analogy between Zimbabwe and Ireland is unavoidable. The Auxiliaries have a direct counterpart in the Loyalists, UDR and RUC in the 6 Cos. The Brits. have practised the art of playing the Orange card for so long in the North that it is second nature for them to do so in Africa. The Rhodesian Army has promised the colonial population that it will not hand over power after the election

LEFT WING FORCES throughout the world are divided /s to what should be the correct attitude to adopt in relation to the events in Afghanistan. The Spanish Communist Party daily, Mundo Obrero was trenchant in opposition to the Soviet action: the Italian Cp echoed a similar line (which like the Spanish CP did not call for a troop withdrawal): the French CP, after a trip by its leader to Moscow gave its fullblooded endorsement of Soviet action: the British CP followed sister parties in Spain and Italy. The united front of Eurocommunism' is certainly one of the first casualties outside Afghanistan, and such could have far-reaching consequences for that 'parliamentary road to socialism' school of thought, in the decade just beginning.

American officials. ied to block loans destined to help develop that country, and Washington's hostile reaction was not limited to economics.

Unable to launch a direct military intervention because of the deep sentiments of American workers following the debacle of Vietnam, Washington has sought to earry out its operations through intermediaries, such as Pakistan's military dictatorship. This regime provides bases for

access across Afghanistan border. With this powerful array of international forces ranged against the revolu-tion, the Afghan government turned to the Soviet Union for aid. Initially money and advisers, were provided. When it looked like the imperialist-backed forces might pull off a bloody Chilestyle counter-revolution right on its southern border, Soviet troops of the Red Army came in, following governmental requests. So the issue is not Soviet intervention, but a growing US interntion - aimed at taking back the gains won by the Afghan masses — that finally forced the Soviet government to respond

Palestinian Liberation Organisation intensified its military and political campaign on behalf of the Palestinian people. Throughout the same decade Ireland's revolutionary forces fought a similar campaign on behalf of the Irish people.

RECOGNITION

Recently the Fianna Fail Government recognised the role of the Palestinian Liberation Organisation in representing the Palestinian people. In Bahrain representatives of the Dublin Government issued a joint communique with the Bahrains agreeing that the Palestinian people had the right to self-determination and to the establishment on an independent State. Lenihan, the Free State Minister for Foreign Affairs in a statement relating to the communique stated that the Palestinian people were entitled to their home-land and that they had a basic right to it. In answering a question Mr Lenihan also stated that he would have no objections to having discussions with Mr Yasser Arafat, the leader of the PLO.

TOMORROW'S STATESMEN

These happenings illustrate the hypocrisy of southern politicians. While Lenihan is southern willing to meet Mr Arafat, the leader of an organisation successfully waging an armed struggle against international imperialism and Zionism, the Fianna Fail Government is busy attempting to smash the continuing struggle for the right of the Irish people to their homeland. The recent mass arrest of members of the Irish Republican Socialist Party is only another notorious example of collaboration policy.

The participants in the present struggle for Irish freedom and self determination should take hear from the P.L.O. breakthrough. The PIO and Arafat were labelled "terrorists" yesterday just as volunteers in the INLA and the IRA are so labelled today. Today's terrorists are most frequently tomorrow's statesmen. Ireland's revolutionary forces can look to the Palestinians and to Zimbabwe and move confidently onwards to victory!

BILL SIRS, General Secretary of the Irish & Steel Trades Confeder-ance was not unduely worried by the attack. Why should he be? The Union has not had a strike in 30 years and has assets of £11½ million. Sirs can use those assets to repair the building because he certainly doesn't intend giving the money to his striking members. The attack on the Union came at the moment when Sirs had agreed to allow steelworkers in private industry to return to their jobs. With attacks from the outside, and sellouts from the Union Executive, the rank and file steelworkers now realise that in order to win their 20% rise, they will have to fight for themselves

developed into a struggle between workers and the Tory Government over basic issues. The British Steel over basic issues. The British Steel Corporation and British Leyland between them have announced that they plan to cut 100,000 jobs by the autumn. The steelworkers are demanding that this redundancy money be paid to them in the form of wage icreases. The Thatcher Government have refused to itervene financially on behalf of the national-ised industries, although Thatcher is using every legislative and 'legal' dirty trick in the book to break the strike. The British Government has even refused an offer of EEC aid to bale the BSC out of its difficulties. The proposed Tory cuts will have massive repercussions in the mining industry. For this reason coal-miners in South Wales and in the North of England have given total support to the steel strike. Trade Unionists from all over Gt Gritain have rallied to help and supported the flying pickets on private sector steelworks in their thousands. Rank and file militancy contrasts sharply with the speeches and the secret deals of the trade union bureaucraey. Len Murray, the TUC leader, has publicly stated that there should be no talk of toppling the Tories. The leadership of one craft union after the other have made deals with employers in the private sector and have compelled their workers to return to work. If the steelworkers are defeated, then the blame can be laid squarely at the door of the Union leadership, rather than the Tory antiworker legislation.

Defy the Law! The steel workers have made non sense of all the Thatcher-inspired anti-picketing laws, by the simple anti-picketing laws, by the simple expedient of ignoring them. Doddery, Denning, the Law Lord, banned secondary picketing but he was defied by thousands of steel-workers. Bill Sirs had called for a halt to secondary picketing pending an appeal, but such a halt would have allowed the private sector the opportunity to import thousands of tons of steel into Britain. The strikers themselves wisely followed their own advice. They closed the norts they advice. They closed the ports, they blockaded the stockpiles, they halted private works. They made the Denning's ruling a dead letter.

More Legislation

If the trade union leadership are blind to the basic issue involved in the steel strike, then Thatcher & Co. are not. The Government when it failed to break the strike in the courts, turned to the police and issued orders that mass pickets were to be dispersed before they reached firms in the private sector. Thatcher called a top brass meeting in Downing Street at which Lord Hailsham, the Lord Chancellor, Sir Michael Havers, the Solicitor General and Willie Whitelaw, the Home Secretary were present. Whitelaw's Irish expertise was called upon, and the order went out that the police should use riot control methods on the pickets. The Rotherham HQ bombing is an indication that the Army is standing in the shadows awaiting its turn to take on the unions

SHOP STEWARDS MILITANT

At a meeting of Dublin shop stewards on January 23rd the leader of the A.T.G.W.U. Matt Merrigan, called for a strong shopstewards movement to protect themselves and their fellow workers against any conspiracy between the F.U.E., the I.D.A. and sell-out elements of Trade Union bureaucracy. In the light of this it is certainly worth noting the sell-out of one such shop-steward.

Pat Casey was employed as a production operator with an American micro-fish company called Bell & Howell. In March 1979 he was asked to become a shopsteward, he decided to accept because he felt the workers on the shop floor were being exploited.

The following are some examples of what Mr. Casey deemed to be unjust and the response to his representations in regard to such:-

1. Contrary to their own policy the company employed persons under the age of 18 and while doing overtime they were not given the minimum break of 30 minutes as stipulated under the Employment of suputated under the Employment of Young Persons Protection Act 1977. After Mr Casey's objections the company ceased to employ any more underage workers, but still did not grant the minimum break to those already employed. those already employed.

2. He complained of poor toilet and sanitary conditions and of his members not having sufficient time for use of such. In this regard he was successful in having conditions improved and in having 8 to 10 minutes allowed for the use of same.

3. Mr Casey succeeded in obtaining a grading structure change which benefitted the workers by about £5.00 per week and charge-hands by £17.00 per week. 4. A sickness scheme. The Union

joined the management in opposing this: their reason being that it would be open to abuse.

5. Disturbance money for moving from Santry to Coolock. He was unsuccessful in making any gain in this regard, the Union accepting the company's submission that com-

pensation wasn't merited.

6. He succeeded in getting improved canteen facilities, these having been almost non-existent.

In August, at a time when Mr Casey had agreed to act as a witness in a damages claim against the company by a factory worker, it was stated by the management to some shop-floor workers that he would be got rid of one way or another.

Things came to a head on September 3rd. Mr Casey objected to management on the point of office desks being put on the factory floor as members felt this was designed to provide over-excessive supervision. Mr Casey was told to F.... Off. Later in the day he was informed that a female employee was being made a temporary Quality Controller. This was contrary to an agreement between the Union and Management that all jobs be advertised. After complaints from the girls on the floor, Mr Casey went to the management and advised them against carrying out the appointment.

Suspended

Later that day he was asked to wait on in the evening as the manage-ment wished to see him. At about 5.10 p.m. he met the management and was informed that he was being suspended pending a meeting, which had already been arranged, on September 7th between the company and the F.U.E. The company claimed that he had made an allegation that one of the management staff had slept with a girl who was subsequently promoted. Mr Casey had in fact only expressed the views of certain workers who later confirmed this at a Labour Court hearing. On the day following the meeting between the company and the F.U.E., he received word that he was being dismissed.

Labour Court
A Labour Court hearing of the case on December 12th decided in favour of the company. The company had made allegations against him which he claims are completely him which he claims are completely untrue, the main one being the allegation against a fellow employee, as already mentioned. In view of the ongoing conflict on shop-floors and in other areas it is certainly worth considering Mr Casey's claims that:

If the Afghan and Soviet forces are successful in defeating the reactionary right-wing offensive, the Afghan people will be in a much better position to achieve their aspirations.

The Soviet move in Afghanistan has also put a big crimp in Washington's war drive against Iran, making it harder for Carter to drag US workers into another Vietnam there. It has gained time for the masses in Nicaragua to advance their struggle with less danger of US intervention. It is a sharp blow to the US rulers' efforts to hold back popular revolutionary upheaval throughout the world.

THE REAL THREAT to peace comes from Washington, not Moscow. The real threat is Carter's campaign to aid the right-wing Afghan guerrilas, to beef up the Pakistani military dictatorship, to establish bases in the Middle East and Africa, and to squander more billions on the war budget. Socialists should not permit the media to think for

them. To compare Afghanistan

with that of Hungry or Czechoslovakia is tendentious. In the Afghan case the Amin regime was universally loathed, thousands were interned, and already the country was 100% dependent on the Russians, and the scale of foreigna counter-revolutionary influence was, even if less than the Soviets claimed, substantial. There has been much talk of the Russians advancing on the oil of the Persian Gulf: but the Russians, for all their problems, remain the world's largest producers, at a rate of 12.4 million barrels a day, and the availability of warm water ports, while obviously convenient, is hardly as serious a goal in the era of intercontinental missiles as it was in the days of Peter the

Reject the Boycott

It is with this background to events that we come to the question of the 1980 Moscow Olympics, and calls, particularly from Carter for a boycott. It is an appeal which will again meet with much instinctive popular support - including in the workers' movement. The reason why such a call should be firmly rejected is because the U.S. appeal has

issue of concern to working people. Carter's main concern is for "the economic interests of our country and our allies". In other words, boycott the Olympic Games to defend the interests of US imperialism. If any further proof were needed that this is what is intended, just think back a bit to 1968 if you were around or remember. Then the Olympics were held in Mexico. On the eve of the Games the pro-US regime shot down hundreds of protesting students in cold blood. No one at the White House batted an eyelid. And then there are the Brit Tories canvassing for boy Many of them cott. simultaneously the most ardent supporters of the British Lions rugby tour to South Africa country where the politics of apartheid determine every single aspect of the way sport is run. It is this Tory government, too, which seeks to punish Moscow at the same time as it re-establishes diplomatic relations with Pinochet in Chile — a classic with product of an imperialist intervention in another country's affairs. So familiar throughout our own history.
