EASTER STATEMENT FROM THE LEADERSHIP OF THE REPUB-LICAN MOVEMENT

"The Leadership of the Republican Movement extends greetings to comrades, friends and supporters at home and abroad on this the 62nd anniversary of the Proclamation of the Irish Republic.

We remember with pride our fallen comrades, whose tragic and untimely deaths have caused sorrow and suffering in many homes. The British presence has ensured this tradition of violent death, sorrow and suffering in every generation. We remember also the untimely deaths of many of our citizens, who died as a result of British interference in our country.

The Leadership of the Republican Movement on this Easter Sunday sends greetings to all the prisoners in England, Ireland and America and pays special tribute to our courageous comrades who are protesting in naked, solitary confinement for prisoner-of-war status inside the jails in the occup-

ied Six Counties.

It has taken eighteen months for the name of H-Block, and the British brutality it represents, to seep through to the media. H-Block has been

eighteen months of im-measurable inhumanity for almost 300 young Irish-men. Their long suffering has only slowly cut its way through the usual medicore

accounts of life in the north,

accounts of life in the north, behind which British repressive rule hides.

H-Block is brutally consistent with this final stage of British imperialist rule.

the future will plead ignorance, but which for us at present is a living reality. H-Block is directly linked to the division of Ireland, to partition, to the British denial of Irish sovereignity. The world should be in

no doubt that the length of the war of national liber-ation and the strength which the Irish Republican Army can exert are proof that we command mass support in the occupied north. We wish to stress the determination of the Irish Republican Movement to continue the struggle for an end to British rule. takes, our units will strike at enemy forces until England declares openly

It is an issue for which an ashamed English people in the future will plead ignor-Throughout Ireland re-pressed and struggling people, besides Republicans, are coming to support the Republican Movement because in it lies their only ultimate hope of peace and prosperity.

Sixty-two years ago a handful of revolutionary visionaries declared the Irish Republic and their action was condemned as a futile use of force. Those that gained from the struggle which Easter 1916 initiated, have condemned with a glaring disrespect for the lessons of history today's legitimate use

WE PRINT BELOW ANOTHER ARTICLE FROM OUR YOUNG COMRADE FROM WEST BELFAST PRESENTLY ON THE 'BLANKET PROTEST' IN THE H-BLOCK

A day never passes in the H-Block without someone being sent to the punishment block on a very petty or framed charge. The average period in the punishment block is four to five days but men have been kept there as long as 46 days. It is hard enough in the H-Block where we remain 'on the blanket' but the strategy behind P-Block is to make life there as hard and as unbearable as as hard and as unbearable as possible for the Republican POW's in an attempt to break our spirit in order to try and reduce the ever increasing number of men on the protest.

The methods used range from The methods used range from physical violence to humiliation of prisoner's. The P-Block is an isolated block of about 30 cells. Total silence is maintained all the time. The cells are bare except for a wooden board (bed) a concrete block to sit on and a concrete slab cemented into the wall serves as a table. It is a concrete must continuady them. They
Block hand out unmerciful
beatings to Republican POW's.

When men complain to a octor and register a formal doctor and register a formal complaint they are charged with making false allegations against a prison officer, for this they receive a further 3 to 4 days punishment, loss of remission etc., when this is finished they are held indefinitely on the grounds that an investigation is to be carried out (by prison staff) to look into the man's allegations. No one makes complaints, its not hard to see why! As its a very pointless exercise. It is a common occurrence to see men arriving back from the PBlock with black eyes and swollen lips etc! eyes and swollen lips etc!

The humiliation tactics are, like wise as brutal, the most common example is that of 3 to 4 screws invading a man's cell; they usually start to assault or intimidate him. Following this they tell him to drop the blanket which he has covering his nakedness. They then make him turn around in full circles several times. On occasions men have been physically held down and bent over to allow the screws to examine them intimately. Another degrading aspect is that men are not aspect is that men are not allowed to use the flush toilet outside their cells. They must use the chamber pot in their cell. They can't empty it and must depend on a bucket being brought around the cells. Some times this does not happen for days and the filthy contents flow over onto the floor and lie there.

On top of all that the Republican POW is subjected to what is termed as a No.1 diet. You receive this diet everyday, it is a starvation diet it consists

of

1. For breakfast, two rounds of
dry bread, a mug of black tea.

2. 'Dinner' two small scoops of
potatoes and small ladle of

portatoes and small ladle of watery soup.

3. 'Tea' same as breakfast.

4. 'Supper' nothing!

Men have been subjected to 6 days and longer on this star-vation diet. The usual is 6 days on then 3 days respite then back

on again.

The prison governors are oblivious of what goes on. They have full knowledge of the facts, they sit in their office and watch naked men being dragged in in front of them by the hair to one of the infamous kangeroo courts. A typical example from one particular incident was when a blanket man was dragged in to a Governor's office for to be tried at one of the kangeroo courts. The blood was pouring from a wound on the man's head and the screws were punching and kicking him. He was semi-conscious, but he heard the Governor say to the over reacting men.

The M.O. who is usually

sent to examine you is a screw with a white coat on (a glorified message boy). All the M.O's are screws. A prisoner in the P. Block is isolated in a freezing cold cell, cut off from his friends and comrades, he is naked except for a blanket, he is kept half starved, his cell reeks with the filth that has overflowed the fifth that has overriowed from the unemptied pot. Every minute he is waiting on the cell door flying open and 3 to 4 screws rushing in to lay into him. The silence is unnerving. He knows he will be dragged and heaten in the Kangeroe and beaten in the Kangaroo court where he wil be sentenced to (usually) 4 days c.c. on No.1 diet plus loss of remission etc This is institutionalised

The most fearful and hated sight now is a white transit van with blackened windows. When it draws into the yard some one is for the punishment block. It used to be normal practice to send all types of prisoner to the same P-Block, now Republican POWs on the blanket are isolated. This is to insure no one will see or over-hear something that they aren't supposed to!

The situation regarding the P

Block is very serious. Many men have been beaten and several men have embarked upon hunger and thirst strikes. At the time of writing two men are very seriously ill. We hope maybe that people will listen to what is said about the terrible conditions here and speak out before some of us end up getting beaten to death in an isolated where no one will know what has happened!

At the time of writing there are two Republican POW's (blanket men) on hunger and thirst strike in the punishment block Long Kesh. They are Tom McFeely and Sean Campbell both from H Block 3. Both men were in solitary confinement as they have been on the blanket they have been on the planker protest quite some time. They were removed from H.3 to the punishment block. There was no reason why these men should have been taken out as they had have been taken out as they had done nothing. Both men were put in the punishment block and informed that they were to be kept there indefinitely (this is a tactic to break the spirit of Republicans on the blanket protest). Tom McFeely was held in the punishment block on another occasion for 46 days. another occasion for 46 days. Both men informed the prison

governor that if they were not taken back to H3 they would make some sort of protest as they had not committed any offence nor were they to be charged. Both men were ignored by the Prison authorities.

They immediately embarked upon a hunger and thirst strike. upon a hunger and thirst strike.
Their demand was to be taken back to H3 to their own cells. Both men were in poor enough condition due to the conditions they normally live in while on the blanket protest, so their health deteriorated quickly. After two days the prison governor informed them they were to be charged. Tom governor informed them they were to be charged, 'Tom McFeely with insulting a medical officer' 'And Sean Campbell with using abusive language.' Both charges were concocted by the prison authorities to trick both men off their protest. They remained on it, their demand the same.

On Thursday 16th Sean Campbell was annointed; at 5

o'clock in the morning he rung the alarm bell in his cell, the screw came and turned it off, as said he wan't going to be dis-turbed by 'Scum.' Apparently another screw arrived on the spot and summoned an M.O. the M.O. arrived and upon the M.O. arrived and upon seeing Sean Campbell's condition sent for a stretcher. Sean was carried out on the stretcher to Hospital (we don't know whether it was the prison or outside hospital). On Friday 17th Tom McFeely was taken out to hospital. out to hospital.

We received this information from a man who was in the same punishment block, we do not know whether both men came off their protest, we heard they had but we are not certain, it is possible they could be dying we have no means of finding out!

Editor's Note: Both Tom McFeely and Sean Campbell came off hunger and thirst strike when they were removed to hospital, since that satisfied their demand to be taken out of the punishment block.

No-one who has the experience of uninterrupted loyalist rule, pogroms, curfews, armed British re-pression in support of sectpression in support of sect-arianism, state sanctioned torture and murder, could be proud of Jack Lynch's nationalism. The pride of the Irish nation lies in the revolutionary Republican Movement and in the people who support the armed struggle, and who resist tyranny.

Besides the changed

circumstances of solid Fianna Fail rule in the 26 Counties, the last few months have also seen movement towards Irish nationalism not just from Lynch but from Fine Gael in opposition.

The reasons for this movement need to be nailed firmly to the mast.

Jack Lynch and Fine Gael see that the IRA cannot be defeated and that continu-ed British rule in the Six Counties is patently impossible without greater resort by the British to mur-der and torture and which would provoke world oppro-brium. Jack Lynch and Fine Gael see that growing nat-ionalist sentiment threatens their own existence. So their recent reaffirmation of Irish nationalism is an nationalism attempt to capitalise on the developments which our armed struggle have created. Had our armed struggle failed then the nationalist people in the Six Counties

would be walked upon by strutting loyalists, and Lynch would still be stand-

Ing idly by.
As it is, the armed struggle has neither failed nor diminished despite fatalities and imprisonments of political activists. In eight years of guerilla warfare the rate of attrition has never exhausted our man-power resources, and now we are entering a new generation of strength. Recently we have acquired new war materials which are an indication of our determination to continue the long struggle. The people are armed through the Irish Republican Army and there is no measure of British terror which can defeat this growing force.

The momentum towards a British withdrawal cannot

With stopped. realisation, the Irish people will have, for the first time in sixty years, the freedom to choose their own form of government without any outside interference. Our Movement has outlined proposals for a new feder-ally structured Ireland and we look forward to the day when we can freely present those proposals before the whole Irish people for their consideration. Our concept of Eire Nua allows for the diverse traditions of our nation and embodies the basic principles of the 1916 Proclamation and the Democratic Programme of the First Dail Eireann. The New Ireland we strive for is one in which Protestant, Catholic and Dissenter can be proud of the common name of Irish people.

# SAI "Writing in his final pamphlet 'The Sovereign People' in March 1916 Patrick Pearse said

SOUTH DERRY ORATION

Hundreds of people attended the Easter commemoration at 'The Loop' in South Derry. After the ceremonies and the reading of the Proclamation. Belfast Republican Gerry Brannigan addressed the crowd:-

Let no man be mistaken as to who will be lord in Ireland when Ireland is free - the people will be Lord and Master."
Pearse's vision was re-inforced by the 1916 E.

Pearse's Vision was re-morecu by the 1936 Country Proclamation which confirmed:
"The right of the people of Ireland to the ownership of Ireland, to the unfettered control of Irish destinies, to be soverign and indefeasible. The long usurpation of that right by a foreign people and government has not extinguished the right nor can it ever be extinguished except by the destruction of the Irish people."

Today is the 62nd Anniversary of the Declaration of the Irish Republic and the vision of the signatories of that proclamation has not yet been realised. It is the intention of the Republican Movement to ensure that that vision becomes a reality. That objective is being pursued with the full knowledge of what is entailed the combatting of the efforts of the British war machine and its local agents in the occupied North and in the Free State. Free State.

Free State.

62 years on Britain still governs Ireland - by armed enforcement in the North and by neo-colonial rule in the 26 counties - through political, economic and cultural manipulation and through the machinery of the multinationals and the E.E.C.

The so-called Irish Republic of the 26 counties is a disgraceful monument to the men of Easter 1916, and a

unifoldiment of James Connolly's prophecy:

"If you remove the English Army tomorrow and hoist the green flag over Dublin Castle, unless you set about the organisation of the Socialist Republic your efforts will be in vain.

England would still rule you. She would rule you through her capitalists, through her landlords, through her financers, through her array of commercial and individualist institutions she has planted in this country

country."
What Connolly was saying was that the physical withdrawal of British Imperialism was not enough - that structures of Government had to be implemented to ensure that the Irish people would no longer be exploited politically or economically but would have effective control over their own destinies.

control over their own destinies.

This of course was not done and following the "settlement" of 1921 the existing political structures set up by British Imperialism were simply taken over and while the Free State had its own army - its own flag - and its own national anthem - the main vehicle for change - the "New Government" - remained firmly mades British influence. under British influence.

under British influence.

The continuing success of the Republican Movement however - forging ahead on all fronts - is now forcing the Free State Government into a "Nationalist" stand-however qualified - as illustrated by its attempt to state the political policies of the Republican movement - and to put its own name to them.

The Republican Movement has stated over this past year that any one of 3 options is presently open to the British Government.

OPTION ONE: That the status quo be maintained - a position which even the British Government concedes is

OPTION TWO: An independent 6 counties jointly supported by Britain and the Free State, and

## UTE 1 0

OPTION THREE: A fake United Ireland under a federal system of Government based on the present partionist structures of Government.

It must be emphasised that any one of these 3 options is beneficial only to the British Government who could withdraw from the expensive and politically embarassing military occupation of the North yet continue to exploit the Irish people through a form of 32 county neo-colonial Rule.

neo-colonia Rule.

The concept of option 3 - a fake united Ireland under a Federal system of Government based on the present partitionist structures of Government - has already been launched by SDLP Deputy Leader - John Hume.

One thing is certain - under any one of these 3 options an attempt would be made to supports the Republican Movement and its supporters - and covernt the achieving of the objectives of the 1916. prevent the achieving of the objectives of the 1916

Easter Proclaimation Easter Proclaimation.

The Republican Movement will, however, continue to explore and combat the threats posed to the interests of the Irish people as a whole whether those threats come from the British or Free State Governments or their local agents in the occupied North.

It will continue - by whatever means are necessary to combat the efforts of the British war machine. To repress the risen nationalist people of the occupied North, whether that repression be of a political or military nature.

It wil continue to expose the repression of political prisoners - many of whom are presently engaged in their heroic fight to retain political status. Let our message of solidarity be carried from this

meeting today.

The struggle to retain political status, to achieve our ultimate objective - a 32 County Democratic Socialist Republic as proclaimed in Easter Week 1916 - will not be easy - but they are ones we will wage relentlessly. The means by which both are achieved are the choice of the British was machine.

But the effort required will be great and will be measured not just by the more dramatic successes that will be achieved - but by consistent - hard day to day work on the ground - as Patrick Pearse said:



You say we should have also carried a report on the Conway Hall meeting, including presumably a report of the comments you made on the failure of the left to take Ireland seriously. We suggest to you, that as far as Socialist Challenge is concerned, considering the extensive coverage we gave Ireland in this issue of the paper the reporting of such remarks would have only discredited the makers of them.

In the event we did carry a short report on the pickets - as opposed to the meeting - In support of the prisoners; pickets incidently in which supporters of this newspaper played a major role in organising and attending. We believe that a report of this activity, added to the other coverage of Ireland we gave in this issue, and indeed other issues of this paper is of greater benefit to the Irish people, than reporting what we regard as sectarian and untruthful remarks made at the London meeting.

Incidently we have also refused to print (ensor if you like) a letter strongly attacking the inactivity of Sinn Fein in supporting a number of the pickets and of its general negative attitude displayed at the Conway Hall meeting.

You accuse us of non-activity on Ireland. We have no wish to enter a slanging match but we notice the refusal of certain individuals in Sinn Fein (Britain), and of the Prisoners Aid Committee to back the International Tribunal on Britain's Presence in Ireland. This is, we would point out the major activity on Ireland now taking place in England and is supported by all the anti-Imperialist groups in Ireland. Socialist Challenge and the IMG are fully involved in this activity; we believe the wide support expressed for the Tribunal in Ireland suggests that your participation would also be welcome.

We have decied not to publish our letter for one reason only. We ould need to reply to the grave would report the facts outlined above. We believe this would make you look foolish and sectarian in the you look foolish and sectarian in the eyes of our readership and we have no wish to drive further a wedge between the left in this country and that section of the Irish solidarity movement you represent. We would feel happier if you were showing the same inclination.

"People's Democracy' openly advocates the laying down of arms, a total surrender. Bernadette McAliskey at the January Coalisland conference spoke sentimentally conference spoke sentimentally about the youth of today not having about the youth of today not having her generation's' experience of the 'big march', as she yearned for a return to the '68-'69 days. But there are other emotions, feelings and experiences generated since, which the revolutionary left tend to ridicule. There is the wee woman in the backstreet with guns in an upstairs room who experiences daily fear in case every neasing for fear in case every passing foot patrol is a raiding party. That isn't a 1968 experience but it grew out of it! There is the granny who didn't know she had the anger or the courage to clout a Brit until he called her "A fucking Paddy". There is the wee lads out with a rifle taking on four experienced and armed Brits. He sees no other method of struggle, and he can struggle confidently when he gets the mandate from the Angry oppressed but marching people. There is the wee girl carrying guns from house-to-dump. These activists engaged in a fife-and-death struggle have convictions based on the totality of their experiences.

### LETTER FROM H-BLOCK MOTHER

We have been asked to publish the following letter from a mother who asks that she remain anony-mous for her son's sake.

I had a visit with my son today (22nd March) in Long Kesh. My (18th Merch 1918) in Long Kesh. My first impression was one of grave concern. He is ten months on the blanket and this is his second visit.

The last visit was at Christmas, that's three months ago, and in that space of time his physical appearance has changed dramatically. He has lost more weight, his eyes have a staring almost wild look about them. The skin on his face and ears is flaking and the part of his chest is flaking and the part of his chest that I could see is covered with pimples

pimples. I couldn't take my eyes off his hands; they look so long and thin, an almost deathlike look about them, white and bony. He was shaking as if he was cold and his lips trembled at times when he spoke; other times he had a nervous almost hysterical laugh when he spoke. His hands trembled almost continuous-los.

I asked him what the conditions were like now. He told me that it was worse now than before. In H3 it is over three weeks since the men have had a wash or shower. They are also not allowed to clean or even brush out their cells. In H5 where my son is, the men are refusing to wash themselves or brush their cells in protest at the filth of the wash basins handed into

For many years the visiting permit arrange-ments in Armagh Gaol have run smoothly, each prisoner has through the O/C of the wing ensured that her permit has been sent out on time for her weekly visit. The usual arrangement is that girls will sent of the permit home having indicated the permit home having indicated verbally to her family to whom she wishes her visit to go. This ensures that should a freed or relative wishes her visit to go. This ensures that should a freed or relative that should a freed or relative that will be make it up to the gaol be unable to make it up to the gaol that the girl is not left visitionless, most soul destroying experience(). Ever since the inception of the Sectarian Northern State in 1921, unemployment and discrimination has been part of the every day life of the anti-unionist people. It was Official Unionist political policy to practice discrimination in employment and housing in order to keep their sectarian state intact, and also to force anti-unionists into mass immigration thereupy preserving their artificial

majority. When British the Government took over political control of the 6 counties through Direct Rule in 1972, the Unionist policies were continued

We believe that unemployment is part of the British Government's ongoing Government's ongoing political repression in the 6 counties directed mainly against the anti-unionist working class; the 200 redundancies at Strathearn Audio in Kennedy Way early in the new year, is an obvious indication of this repressive policy.
