PANTOLINE IN LEISTER HOUSE.

In almost every generation for the past 150 years, daring men and true men have over and over again set all Ireland laughing at the Dublin Castle bailiffs of the British Crown; but the laugh raised against them has never been as loud, as ironical as that which is still ringing from end to end of the land, at the recollection of the happenings of Dec. 23rd, 1939, when a handful of courageous men raided His Britannic Lajecty's Magazine in the Phoenix Park, Dublin, and proceeded quite leisurely to load up a line of lorries with some 30 tons of Empire

ammunition. And they got away with it!

The fun of it was only rivalled by the laughing stock made of themselves by the muddlers of Herrion St, when they solemnly called the Free State" Partition Parliament together for the purpose of rutting a patch or two on the vaunte, eastiron, watertight, foolproof Offences against the Empire Act enacted last Autumn by a minority of the Twenty-

Six Countles Legislators.

The proceedings in Leinster House on Jan. 3rd and 4th, outrivalled Jimmy O'Den's Pantomine and revived all the laughter that had begun to die down. The spectacle of de Valera saying solemnly that his own Supreme Court Inew no law and he knew it all, and that he would have to get a "disciplined" Judiciary like his "disciplined" Parliamentary Party (only 51 of whom he could gather up to vote for the newer Coercion, while over 20 actually present in Leinster House refused to cast a vote for it), was too funny for words. And the touching duet entitled "Rule Britan-nia" sung by himself and Frank Mac-Dermott drew tears of laughter from the eyes of "Discffected" Iroland. And the recitation by Johnnie Hac-Entee of the Cocreion Speech of every British Chief Secretary who ever occupied Dublin Castle, was one of the triumphs of this two-day Pantemine; while the clowing done by Gerry

Boland and Frank Ailien - especially th latter's screamingly funny boast that he had often pinched more stuff himself with fewer men - won the laughter of all Ireland. It was the greatest exhibition of stupidity. futility, and littleness over given by any pack of Britishers in any part of the world.

What the people are saying be-tween gusts of laughter is this: -If de Valera, even with the aid of Scan T.O'Kelly's whip, could not force or induce, coax or stampede over 20 members of his own Party into the division lobbies to vote for his futile Repairs to the Gorrion
Bill that has already failed, how can
he expect outsiders to support it?
The people of Ireland never

authorised him or his prodecessors in Office to wage war on the Republic of Pearse and Clarke and Connolly and Brughas Thoir hearts are with the young men of to-day as the hearts of their fathers and grandfathers were with the young men of other days, and when Cosgrave and de Valora and their Associates shall have longaged down in defeat and execution like all the British bailiffs of the past, the soldiers of the Republic whom they plan to persecute to-day will be remembered and henoured in a

A sentence of 18 months hard labour was passed in Bolfast on Saturday, Jan. 6th, on Joseph Movin, Upper Library Street, Belfast for being in possession of a copy of "Prison Bars", which contained a statement "likely to cause disaffection to his Majesty".

The statement in question was a copy of a letter from Rory Campbell, who is serving 20 years in England, which was written to his mother. It is interesting to note that this lotter was written in His Majesty's Prison, was consored by His Majosty's Authorities and was eventually delivered by His Majesty's Servents. Now, after a lapse of months, it is being used by the Craigavon Junta in their offorts to crush the Cause for which Rory Campbell and Joseph Nevin are proud to suffer.

On Doc. 29th, last, a Bomb Ex. plosion occurred in the offices of the "Irish Press" Belfast and three days later another Bomb Explosion took place in the Hawkir Street Fire

Station, Dorry.

On Christmas Day firemen from this station deliberately turned hoses on the Internees in Derry Jail, some of whom are now suffering from pnoumonia as a result. The "Trish Press" deliberately set out to misrepresent the Mutiny in Derry as well as the motives of the men involved.

The method adopted by the 26 Counties C.I.D. in arresting Thos. Brady in Co. Cavan during last week is perhaps the most cospicable used for many years. A 'phone message was sent to a friend of Brady's in Dublin, informing him that his mother was seriously ill.

The mossage eventually reached Tom Brady who immediately hurried home from Dublin to find, not as he expected - a sick mother, but a party of police thugs, who had used the above ruse to capture him.
