## Derryman - Next to go on Hunger Strike!!!

PATSY O'HARA, A TWENTYFOUR YEAR OLD VOLUNTEER IN THE INLA IS TO GO ON HUNGER STRIKE AT 12 MIDNIGHT ON SATURDAY. PATSY AND RAYMOND MCCREESH FROM THE DROSSMAGLEN AREA WILL JOIN BOBBY SANDS AND FRANCIE HUGHES WHO ARE ALREADY ON HUNGER STRIKE FOR POLITICAL STATUS.

PATSY O'HARA WHO COMES FROM THE BISHOP STREET AREA IS CURRENTLY SERVING EIGHT YEARS IN LONG KESH FOR POSSESSION OF A HAND GRENADE AND SINCE HIS SENTENCE IN MAY 1979 HE HAS BEEN ONE OF THE BLANKET PROTESTERS.

Patsy's story is not untypical of many in this community who have suffered over the years since the present struggle began. His elder brother was interned in 1971 and another brother, Tony, was himself imprisoned for five years.

When Patsy was fourteen he was shot in the foot by a British soldier after they had opened fire on a group of youths standing at a barricade in the Brandywell.

Since then Patsy's life has been one of total involvement in the struggle against British Imperialism, eventually resulting in his arrest and subsequent imprisonment in 1979.

The people of Derry can gain no real satisfaction by the fact that yet another Derryman has been forced to take this disastrous step in facing the tortuous struggle of a hunger strike.

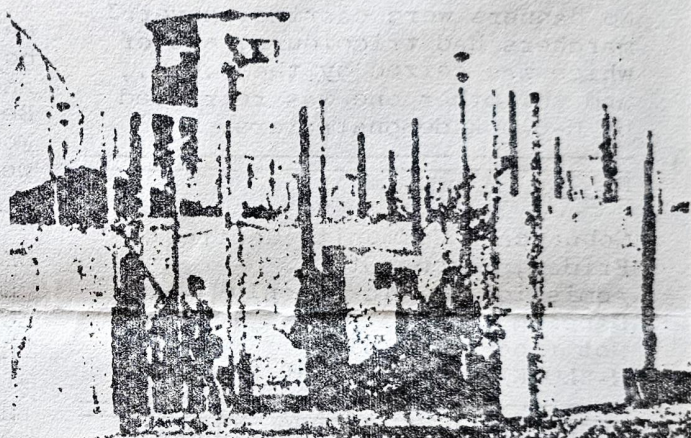
But, those who know Patsy O'Hara fully recognise his personal commitment and determination and are well aware that he will go the whole way to secure political status for his comrades and himself.

## RUC brutality

WHILST EVERYONE'S MIND IS FIRMLY SET ON SEEING AN OUTCOME TO THE HUNGER STRIKE, THERE ARE STILL THE REMAINING PROBLEMS OF BRITISH BRUTALITY TO CONTEMPLATE.

On Tuesday evening a sixteen year old youth from the Creggan area suffered severe facial injuries after being struck at point blank range with a plastic bullet. The youth who was searching the William Street area for another member of his family was so badly injured that he required a three hour operation.

The injuries he received included a broken jaw, loss of most of his teeth severe loss of blood and extreme shock.

The injuries were inflicted by the so-called forces of law and order, the RUC. Regulations stipulate that both plastic and rubber bullets are to be ricocheted off a wall and/or the ground and in this case, as in so many others, this regulation was completely ignored by the RUC.



## WATERSIDE DEMONSTRATORS ATTACKED

As marchers made their way down Spencer Rd, harassed by R.U.C. all the way, they were ambushed by a crowd of 100 loyalists, firing glass and bottles at H-Block supporters.

The R.U.C. made no effort to stop the attack. In fact they seemed to be in collusion with the loyalists.

It was fortunate that there were no serious injuries, several people suffered cuts and bruises and no arrests were made other than a H-Block protester who was held illegally for  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour.

No banners were carried, several marchers had tricolours, one of which was seized by the R.U.C., and the other one was retrieved by H-Block demonstrators.
