Within the past few months also COUNT PLUNKETT and many others have been released for "health reasons" after a slow, deliberate reduction of their vitality.

To-day there are still in the hands of the Murderer hundreds of men and women.

IN BELFAST JAIL the prisoners have been in handcuffs DAY AND NIGHT from 21st January, 1919, to the middle of February, and they are still in solitary confinement there. Since 21st January, 1919, they have not been permitted to attend Mass.

IN MOUNTJOY JAIL the prisoners have been in handcuffs from 13th January, 1919, up to the middle of February, except on Sundays, and some are still in solitary confinement.

IN CORK the prisoners are in handcuffs since the 17th January, 1919.

IN MARYBORO', LIMERICK, DERRY the Murderer is at work, too.
