

Vote SINN FEIN

Membership of the E.C. has resulted in control of the Fishing Industry in Ireland being taken over by an administration in Brussels in which we have virtually no control.

In the Supreme Body of the E.C., we have 3 out of 76 votes. On the Commission (which drafts the budget) we have 1 out of 17 votes. In the European Parliament itself we have 15 out of 518 votes. *The result has been that:*

1. We have been allocated 25 p.c. of fishing waters and 4 p.c. of the catch
2. We have no control over conservation of Fishing Stocks in what should be our own Fishing Zone.
3. Development of the Fish Processing Industry has been restricted by funding allocation decided in Brussels.
4. As with part Three, Aquaculture developments, with potential export value of millions of pounds. £35 million of fish products are imported into this State each year.

Sinn Fein will work for withdrawal from the E.C. For trading with other countries on a basis compatible with the need and reserves of the Irish Fishing Industry.

For a 200 mile exclusive Fishing Zone.

For the right to set our own quotas and conservation programmes.
