On 14th August 1969, after three days of resistance, British troops marched onto the streets of Derry. They were not there to protect Nationalists, but to uphold British rule and suppress community resistance.

The British stood with fixed bayonets facing the defenders of the Bogside while the Loyalist and RUC aggressors looked on, secure behind British steel.

Less than one year later, British troops were shooting Nationalists on the streets of Derry. Twenty years on, the struggle for peace and democracy continues.
