

Michael Conway, Irish Republican Army, Sentenced to Death.



THE CRY FOR JUSTICE.

Michael Conway, the boy hero of Tipperary, condemned to death on July 21st by the Military Tribunal set up by Cosgrave in 1931 in his last desperate effort to destroy the soldiers of the Irish Republic, and which is to-day being used by De Valera for the same purpose.

The verdict of Conway's so-called trial was dictated by Cabinet Minister McEntee a month previous, June 21st, from a public platform in Lucan. Free State Officer Bennet responded worthily to the dictation of his renegade master when he read the death sentence on Michael Conway, July 21st.

Conscious of his innocence of any crime save that of loving his country and striving as Emmet and Pearse and Mellows had striven, to secure its freedom, Michael Conway defiantly faced the Norburys who sat in judgement on him, proudly proclaiming his allegiance to the Army of the Irish Republic.

Calmly, bravely, with the courage inspired by the justice of the Cause he served Michael Conway heard his death sentence. Unflinching he faced the hangman's rope—willingly offering his young life in vindication of his Republican faith.

But the Soul of Ireland Revolted Against the Martyrdom of the fearless young Hero.

De Valera and his co-ercionist colleagues realised that in sentencing Michael Conway to the gallows—they but hastened their own downfall as British Cabinet Ministers in Ireland.
